Dear Mr. Wondrack:

The Department of Ecology (Ecology) is currently in the process of reviewing older files. Our review indicates the last environmental report received regarding your site was a *Voluntary Assessment*, from Fulcrum Environmental Consulting, dated March 10, 2000.

Our response (via letter dated May 8, 2000) indicated no further action was necessary for the release from the two 8,000 gallon tanks. **However, further action is necessary for the release from the two 500 gallon waste oil tanks.** To date, Ecology has not received any information that additional work has taken place. If that is not correct, please submit any reports, data, or information to me at the address listed on the letterhead above.

Under the Model Toxics Control Act (MTCA), Ecology maintains a statewide database of confirmed or suspected contaminated sites. This database is made available to the public upon request and online at <http://www.ecy.wa.gov/programs/tcp/cscs/CSCSpage.HTM>. The above-referenced property is included in this database.

Please note that inclusion in the database does **not** mean that Ecology has made a determination regarding the identification of any potentially liable person(s) under the Model Toxics Control Act (administered under Chapter 173-340 WAC).

It is the policy of the Department of Ecology to work cooperatively with persons to accomplish prompt and effective site cleanups. Ecology prefers to achieve site cleanup cooperatively through independent cleanup actions (WAC 173-340-510). Cooperating with Ecology in planning or conducting remedial actions is not an admission of guilt or liability.

Our records indicate you had participated in the Voluntary Cleanup Program (VCP). The option to join again is still available to you. Ecology offers technical assistance and review of work plans, assessments, and remedial actions. Ecology can, through the VCP, determine if the entire site warrants **no further action**.
