Two hard copies are available at Kenmore City Hall at the Reception Desk and at the Kenmore King County Library at Documents for Public Review at 6531 NE 181th Street, in Kenmore.

There is a 30-day comment period for citizens to review and send comments about the report to Ecology. The comment period is scheduled May 1 through May 30, 2014 and Ecology welcomes comments and questions. The Site Register Notice will be posted on May 1 and comments may be sent by email or standard US mail to Maura O'Brien. There is no fact sheet and no public meeting is scheduled for this report.

The Periodic Review Report conclusions are that the Consent Decree and Restrictive Covenant with groundwater compliance monitoring are effective in protecting public health and the environment from exposure to hazardous substances. The Restrictive Covenant for the property is in place and continues to be effective in protecting public health and the environment from exposure to hazardous substances and protecting the integrity of the cleanup action. Next periodic review is scheduled for 2019 or commencement of the development with the Cleanup Action Plan.
