Dear Mr. Zamudio:

Under the Model Toxics Control Act (MTCA), chapter 70.105D RCW, which governs the cleanup of contaminated sites in Washington State, the Department of Ecology (Ecology) may identify persons that it finds liable for the release of hazardous substances at a site. Before making such a finding, Ecology must provide persons with notice and an opportunity to comment on the proposed finding. Any person whom Ecology finds, based on credible evidence, to be liable is known as a "potentially liable person" or "PLP".

As a result of an initial investigation conducted by Ecology at the above-reference site, a release of a hazardous substance has occurred and further action will be required. Based on this investigation, Ecology has added this property to our database of confirmed and suspected contaminated sites.

Proposed Finding of Liability

Based on credible evidence, Ecology is proposing to find Juan Zamudio liable under RCW 70.105D.040 for the release of hazardous substances at the Roby's Services facility (Site). This proposed finding is based on the following evidence:

- 1. According to the Yakima County Assessor's webpage (http://yes.co.yakima.wa.us/Assessor/parcel_details.aspx?id=75970), Juan Zamudio is listed as the current owner of the property.
- 2. During removal of five underground storage tanks in 2001, petroleum impacted soils and groundwater were discovered at the property. During demolition of the service station building on the property, and large amount of petroleum-impacted soil was discovered beneath the building footprint.
- 3. Petroleum concentrations in soils and groundwater at the site exceeded MTCA Method A Cleanup levels.

Opportunity to Respond to Proposed Finding of Liability

In response to Ecology's proposed finding of liability, you may either:

- 1. Accept your status as a PLP without admitting liability and expedite the process through a voluntary waiver of your right to comment. This may be accomplished by signing and returning the enclosed form or by sending a letter containing similar information to Ecology;
- 2. Challenge your status as a PLP by submitting written comments to Ecology within thirty (30) calendar days of the date you receive this letter; or
- 3. Choose not to comment on your status as a PLP.

After reviewing any comments submitted or after 30 days if no response has been received, Ecology will make a final determination regarding your status as a PLP and provide you with written notice of that determination.

Identification of Other Potentially Liable Persons

Ecology has notified the following additional persons that they are potentially liable for the release of hazardous substances at the Site:

1. Sara Roby, 800 Buena Road, Buena, WA

If you are aware of any other persons who may be liable for the release of hazardous substances at the Site, Ecology encourages you to provide us with their identities and the reason you believe they are liable. Ecology also suggests you contact these other persons to discuss how you can jointly work together to most efficiently clean up the Site.

Responsibility and Scope of Potential Liability

Please note that Ecology may either conduct, or require PLPs to conduct, remedial actions to investigate and clean up the release of hazardous substances at a site. PLPs are encouraged to initiate discussions and negotiations with Ecology and the Office of the Attorney General that may lead to an agreement on the remedial action to be conducted.

Please also note that each liable person is strictly liable, jointly and severally, for all remedial action costs and for all natural resource damages resulting from the release of hazardous substances at a site. If Ecology incurs remedial action costs in connection with the investigation or cleanup of real property and those costs are not reimbursed, then Ecology has the authority under RCW 70.105D.055 to file a lien against that real property to recover those costs.

Next Steps in Cleanup Process

In response to the release of hazardous substances at the Site, Ecology intends to conduct the following actions under MTCA:

1. Ecology has been conducting cleanup work at this site since 2011 under a Clean Sites Initiative Agreement with Sara Roby and Juan Zamudio. Cleanup actions included removal of a large volume of petroleum-impacted soils, application of a chemical oxidant at the bottom of the excavation to promote rapid degradation of petroleum constituents in groundwater, and installation of an infiltration gallery to deliver additional chemical oxidant to the groundwater at the site. Ecology has been conducting quarterly groundwater monitoring since the completion of the removal action.

For a description of the process for cleaning up a site under MTCA, please refer to the enclosed fact sheet.

Ecology's policy is to work cooperatively with PLPs to accomplish the prompt and effective cleanup of contaminated sites. Please note that your cooperation in planning or conducting remedial actions at the Site is not an admission of guilt or liability.
