AMENDMENT OF AGREED ORDER

The parties to this Order have met and conferred with each other regarding changes to the approved work scope for the Order. The parties are agreed that based upon the information collected as part of the Phase I RI that a Phase II RI/FS (which was originally contemplated by the parties as being a possibility for the above referenced site) is not necessary and that a detailed remedial evaluation in the form of a Phase II FS can be completed as an additional task of the Phase I RI/FS under this Order. It is the parties intention through this amendment to provide a complete RI/FS set of documents that will be sufficient to enable Ecology to make decisions upon the final Cleanup Action Plan (CAP).

Accordingly, Order No. DE 983TC-N273 is modified as follows:

1. The requirements of Section IV.1 ("Work to Be Performed") are hereby modified to include the provisions of Golder Associates' letter of April 4, 1995 to the approved Scope of Work and schedule (Exhibit A to the existing order). Golder Associates letter of April 4, 1995 is incorporated into the Agreed Order by reference as an integral and enforceable part of the Order.


2. This amendment shall be effective on the date it is signed by the authorized representative of the Department of Ecology.


