

**WAC 197-11-970 Determination of nonsignificance (DNS).**

DETERMINATION OF NONSIGNIFICANCE

Truck City Truck Stop MTCA Cleanup Project

Description of proposal:

- Remove the truck scale and associated concrete pad prior to excavation activities.
- Excavate and remove residual petroleum contaminated soil at four areas, located east of the current diesel pump island.
- Characterize each area of excavation by collecting soil samples throughout the excavation to assess the lateral and vertical extent of impact.
- Saturated contaminated soil within the smear zone at each excavation locale will be excavated/removed. Each test pit will be dewatered to provide access to saturated contaminated soil.
- Collect confirmation soil samples from each area of excavation.
- Reinstall new monitoring wells in excavated areas, after completion of the above tasks.
- Backfill the excavation area with clean, imported fill to existing ground surface elevation and compact consistent with construction specifications associated with the jail. Implement vapor intrusion protection in building construction, as necessary.
- The second phase of the remedial action involves in situ bioremediation using enhanced aerobic biodegradation to expedite the biodegradation of gasoline and diesel petroleum hydrocarbons and fuel associated volatile organic compounds in soil and groundwater by adding oxygen.
- Conduct a baseline groundwater sampling event at the Property's monitoring wells before initiating the in situ bioremediation task.
- Conduct two years of consecutive quarterly groundwater monitoring events followed by semiannual monitoring, as necessary, to evaluate groundwater quality at the Site.
