This project involves 0.22 acres of soil disturbance for remedial construction activities. Construction activities include demolition of the existing building, soil excavation and the removal of contaminated materials.

The receiving water is Wide Hollow Creek, which feeds into the Yakima River (for stormwater accumulated onsite outside of the contaminated zone). Dewatering water will be treated and discharged to the sanitary sewer.

Any person desiring to present their views to the department of Ecology regarding this application may do so in writing within thirty days of the last date of publication of this notice. Comments shall be submitted to the department of Ecology. Any person interested in the department's action on this application may notify the department of their interest within thirty days of the last date of publication of this notice. Ecology reviews public comments and considers whether discharges from this project would cause a measurable change in receiving water quality, and, if so, whether the project is necessary and in the overriding public interest according to Tier II anti degradation requirements under WAC 173-201A-320.
