Mr. McElroy,

The removal process should be relatively simple. We need a request from the property owner, which details why the site is eligible to have the deed restriction removed. In this case, I believe the deed restriction needed to be present as long as dinoseb was present in groundwater above 7 parts per billion.

Once we have received the request, we will have to go through a 30-day public comment period; that is a requirement of WAC 173-340-440. When that period is over, a document can be recorded with the county that rescinds the deed restriction.
