



WONDRACK SITE UPDATE

December 2004

The Washington State Department of Ecology is pleased to provide the following update regarding the current site status. Following is a summary of planned activities:

Work to be performed:

- As is presently planned, an environmental contractor will mobilize their construction equipment at the site during the third or fourth week of December 2004.
- Soon after Christmas or the New Year, the contractor will remove the southern property fence and part of its western fence. The contractor will also raze the on-site garage.
- Following this, the contractor will begin excavation of the site to a depth of 5-6 feet. Excavated soils will be hauled in covered trucks to the East Wenatchee Regional Landfill.
- Excavation of the petroleum contaminated soils will continue for an estimated 2-3 weeks.
- After excavation, the shallow 5-6 foot deep pit will be refilled with clean fill to grade.

During this two to three week period the sound of heavy equipment and their backup alarms will be regularly heard during business hours. There may also be odors of petroleum from the soils as they are disturbed and excavated. These temporary annoyances will continue until the site is backfilled with clean fill and the project is completed.

Who's doing the work?

The Responsible Party for the Wondrack site cleanup is the Chevron Products Company of San Ramon, California. Their consultant for this cleanup is the Science Applications International Corporation of Bothell, Washington. The contractor will be Pacific Northern Environmental of Longview, Washington.

Ecology will oversee these efforts and will provide ongoing review and support as necessary.
