

**WAC 197-11-970 Determination of nonsignificance (DNS).**

DETERMINATION OF NONSIGNIFICANCE

Description of proposal

An interim action conducted under the Model Toxics Control Act (MTCA). Contaminated soil and sediment interim removal action in specific areas of the former gun club on Boeing Everett property. Soils and sediment are contaminated with high concentrations of metals and polyaromatic hydrocarbons (PAHs).

Proponent: The Boeing Company

Location of proposal, including street address, if any: This interim action will be conducted on property owned by the the Boeing Company. Specifically work will occur within in Area C and Pond D (of Area A). Refer to figures 1 through 6 of the environmental checklist.

Lead agency: Washington State Department of Ecology

The lead agency for this proposal has determined that it does not have a probable significant adverse impact on the environment. An environmental impact statement (EIS) is not required under RCW 43.21C.030 (2)(c). This decision was made after review of a completed environmental checklist and other information on file with the lead agency. This information is available to the public on request.
