Proposed Removal from the Hazardous Sites List Available for Review and Public Comment

The Washington State Department of Ecology (Ecology) is proposing to remove the Recycled Aluminum Metals Co (RAMCO) site, located at 104 Parallel St. within the Dallesport Industrial Park in Dallesport, Washington, from its Hazardous Sites List. The Hazardous Sites List is a statewide list of contaminated properties. The Site is currently ranked a "2" on the list. A rank of "1 is the highest level of concern compared to other sites on the list, and a rank of "5" is the lowest.

Site Background

From approximately 1982 until 1993, the Recycled Aluminum Metals Company (RAMCO) took in material from aluminum smelters. RAMCO then extracted residual aluminum from this material. The extraction process resulted in wastes being generated. One waste was called salt cake. A second type of waste consisted of captured airborne waste and was called bag house dust. These wastes have the potential to leach contaminants like chloride, nitrates, nitrite, cyanide and ammonia into surface and groundwater.

From 1982 to 1989, these wastes were buried in the unlined disposal site located at the east end of the Dallesport Industrial Park. Between 2007 through 2010, the Washington State Department of Ecology and the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) removed over 135,000 tons of waste from the site. After the waste was removed, the Port of Klickitat filled the excavation site and installed a final cover designed to control erosion. Based on sampling performed by EPA before and six months after the final waste removal, it appears that pollutants from the RAMCO disposal area have not migrated to surrounding surface water.
