RE: Progress Update, Boeing Field Chevron, Agreed Order No. DE 10947

A significant milestone was reached during this reporting period, as discussed below:

- 1. Terracon incorporated Ecology's revisions to the Remedial Investigation Work Plan and submitted the revised report to Ecology for review and approval on Friday, April 15, 2016.
- 2. No additional sampling and/or testing reports were received by Boeing Field Chevron during this reporting period.
- 3. No work plan deviations were necessary, as no field work was performed during this period.
- 4. Terracon had no contact with representatives of the local community, public interest groups, press, or federal, state, or tribal governments during this reporting period, with the exception of Ecology.
- 5. Terracon does not anticipate problems in meeting the schedule or objectives set forth in the SOW and Work Plan at this time.
- 6. No actual or anticipated problems or delays are expected at this time.
- 7. No changes in key personnel were made during this reporting period.
- 8. During the next reporting period, Terracon anticipates receiving Ecology comments to the Revised Draft Remedial Investigation Work Plan from Ecology. In addition, we anticipate decommissioning wells EX-N and EX-S, located west of the existing dispenser canopy.
