

Thank you for submitting the results of your independent remedial action(s) for review by the State of Washington Department of Ecology (Ecology). Ecology appreciates your initiative in pursuing this administrative option under the Model Toxics Control Act (MTCA).

Ecology's Toxics Cleanup Program has reviewed the following information regarding the Lake Tapps Grocery and Café Site located at 18929 9th Street East Sumner, Washington 98390. The cleanup report submitted with your application is composed of several sections with a cover sheet at the beginning of each section. The sections are as follows:

Based upon the above listed information Ecology has determined that, at this time, the release of Petroleum Hydrocarbons into the Soil and groundwater no longer poses a threat to human health or the environment for areas as described in the above referenced report.

Therefore, Ecology is issuing this determination that no further remedial action is necessary at this site under MTCA, chapter 70.105D RCW. However, please note that because your actions were not conducted under a consent decree with Ecology, this letter is written pursuant to RCW 70.105D.030(1)(i) and does not constitute a settlement by the state under RCW 70.105D.040(4) and is not binding on Ecology.

Ecology's no further action determination is made only with respect to the release identified in the independent remedial action report dated July 1999. This no further action determination applies only to the area of the property affected by the release identified in the report at Lake Tapps Grocery and Café Site located at 18929 9th Street East Sumner, Washington 98390. It does not apply to any other release or potential release at the property, any other areas on the property, nor any other properties owned or operated by the applicant.

The state, Ecology, and its officers and employees are immune from all liability and no cause of action of any nature may arise from any act or omission in providing this determination.

This letter is to inform you that the Tacoma-Pierce County Health Department (TPCHD) has reviewed the March 2002 request for "No Further Action" pertaining to the 1995 underground storage tank removal for the above referenced property.

Information contained in this latest submittal indicates that petroleum related contamination associated with the underground storage tank (UST) onsite has been determined to be within acceptable levels. At this time, the TPCHD requires no further investigation or remedial actions. This determination is based solely on information provided to the TPCHD and does not constitute a determination from any other regulatory agency.

This no further action determination is made only with respect to the USTs identified in the TPCHD permit # 95046 and applies only to the area of the property where the said USTs were removed at 18929 - 9th St E, Sumner, WA, as identified in Independent Remedial Action Report for this site.
