**STATE ENVIRONMENTAL POLICY ACT (WAC 197-11-970)  
DETERMINATION OF NONSIGNIFICANCE**

Description of proposal: 730 Myrtle LLC and Seattle Iron and Metals propose an interim action (IA) at the Site. The IA will be conducted under an approved Washington Department of Ecology Toxics Cleanup Program Interim Action Work Plan (IAWP) as required by the Model Toxics Control Act WAC 173-340 and the Agreed Order No. DE 13458 for the cleanup site. The proposed IA will address limited areas of known soil contamination during installation of a stormwater conveyance and treatment system that is intended to reduce transport of contaminants at the Site to the Duwamish River through the existing stormwater conveyance system. The construction of the stormwater system will include trenching for conveyance piping and excavation for manholes and other subsurface treatment structures in areas of elevated contaminant concentrations on the property to depths up to 16 feet below ground surface. The stormwater system has been designed to avoid installation of significant structures in contaminated areas to the extent possible, and therefore only isolated areas of contamination are expected to be encountered during stormwater system construction. Contaminated soil will be excavated and disposed at an approved offsite facility and appropriate confirmation sampling conducted to meet the requirements of the IAWP.
