Restrictive Covenants are tools that are not available to City of Tacoma Land Use staff when reviewing permit applications. As such, the limitations imposed by restrictive covenants to a parcel alone are insufficient. The site location and specifics also need to be entered into the City of Tacoma's database so that land use staff is alerted in evaluating any possible future use application. This will insure that City staff will be alerted to site restrictions when the application is reviewed.

Response: Currently, I am coordinating with Shirley Schultz of the City of Tacoma (Principal Planner, Building and Land Use Services) regarding this matter. She is coordinating internally with her management staff the best way to move forward with getting environmental covenants in their GIS system and/or permitting system. Executive Director	Washington State Department of Ecology (Ecology) reviewed the post-cleanup site conditions and monitoring data to ensure that human health and the environment are being protected at the site. Site
Bill Anderson	cleanup was implemented under the Model Toxics Control Act (MTCA) regulations, Chapter 173-340 Washington Administrative Code (WAC).
	 Based on its review of the Site, Ecology concluded: The remedial action conducted at the Site appears to be protective of human health and the

Some TPH-O soil cleanup levels may not have been met at the Site; however the cleanup action complies with cleanup standards, since the long-term integrity of the containment system is ensured and the requirements for containment technologies in have been met. The groundwater cleanup levels for TPH-O, Cadmium, Chromium and Lead may not have been met at the Site. There is an extremely low probability that the Site groundwater will be used for drinking water purposes. The Restrictive Covenant for the property is in place and will be effective in protecting public health from exposure to hazardous substances and protecting the integrity of the cleanup action and that the requirements of the Restrictive Covenant are being met.
