Thank you for working with the Washington State Department of Ecology (Ecology) on the Bothell Former Hertz Site (Site). This letter provides written notification that the remedial investigation, feasibility study, and interim actions required at the Site by Agreed Order No. DE 8375 (Order) under the Model Toxics Control Act (MTCA), Chapter 70.105D RCW, have been satisfactorily completed. The Order became effective on May 12, 2011. This letter also describes the next steps for the Site.

Completion of Remedial Actions Required by the Order

Ecology has determined the requirements of the Order have been satisfied. Ecology made this determination pursuant to Section [IX] (Satisfaction of Order).

The remedial actions required by the Order are specified in Section [VII] (Work to Be Performed). The City of Bothell was required to complete a Remedial Investigation/Feasibility Study (RI/FS), Draft Cleanup action Plan (DCAP), and interim remedial actions at the Site. After inspecting the Site and reviewing the supporting documentation, Ecology has determined the remedial actions in Section [VII] have been satisfactorily completed.

Ecology will complete a Draft Cleanup Action Plan (DCAP) for the Site. After review and consideration of comments received during the public comment period, Ecology will issue a final Cleanup Action Plan (CAP).

The CAP will be implemented in an agreed order. Negotiations for the agreed order are in progress, and Ecology looks forward to continuing this working relationship.
