Soil and groundwater contamination in Sudden Valley's Area Z (Area Z) was discovered in 1999 and reported to the Washington State Department of Ecology in accordance with the Model Toxics Control Act (MTCA; WAC 173-304). Subsequent site investigations and cleanup actions were conducted between 1999 and 2014 at Area Z. Results of these studies were reviewed by Ecology under the Voluntary Cleanup Program in 2014. Ecology concluded that additional information was required to demonstrate compliance with MTCA requirements.

Anchor QEA was retained by Wilson Engineering and Sudden Valley in 2017 to resolve data gaps, assess compliance of the site conditions with MTCA requirements, and recommend final cleanup actions for the site. The Data Report and Cleanup Plan (Plan) submitted to Ecology on June 8<sup>th</sup>, 2018 outlines results of supplemental sampling events and outlines site cleanup actions.
