The schedule for completion of the Remedial Investigation (RI) phase of the project is stipulated within Agreed Order DE15639, with an effective date of 3/29/18. The Agreed Order scope of work stipulates the Completion of RI Field Work (PLPs submittal of field data to Ecology) within 12 months following Ecology's approval of the Final RI Work Plan. Ecology approved the work plan on 8/24/18.

The RI investigation has been proceeding in phases, based on access considerations and as new data inform the conceptual site model. One of the primary objectives of the RI is to define the extent of contamination. One additional limited phase of investigation is anticipated to likely be needed to define the downgradient extent of contamination, based on field observations made during the latest investigation work conducted in December 2019. As such, the Agreed Order schedule needs to be revised. We understand that an interim report may be prepared and submitted to Ecology, presenting the results of field work completed through December of 2019. This interim deliverable is at the sole discretion of the Coleman and the PLP group.

Ecology hereby revises the Agreed Order date for submittal of the Draft RI Report to Ecology to be **due by December 31, 2020**.
