Thank you for the opportunity to comment on the determination of nonsignificance for the Brewster 7-12 Modernization Project, proposed by Brewster School District. We have reviewed the documents and have the following comments.

TOXICS CLEAN-UP

The facility addressed in this proposal has an institutional control and is listed on the Uniform Environmental Covenants Registry, Ecology Facility/Site ID # 7994127; TCP Cleanup Site ID # 422 Institutional controls help to reduce or eliminate exposure to hazardous substances at a cleanup site. Examples of institutional controls include fences, barriers, signage, and water use restrictions. The proposed action must follow the conditions described in the institutional control. WATER QUALITY

Project with Potential to Discharge Off-Site

If the project anticipates disturbing ground with the potential for stormwater discharge off-site, the NPDES Construction Stormwater General Permit is recommended. This permit requires that the SEPA checklist fully disclose anticipated activities including building, road construction and utility placements. Obtaining a permit may take 38-60 days.

The permit requires that a Stormwater Pollution Prevention Plan (Erosion Sediment Control Plan) shall be prepared and implemented for all permitted construction sites. These control

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measures <u>must</u> be able to prevent soil from being carried into surface water and storm drains by stormwater runoff. Permit coverage and erosion control measures must be in place prior to any clearing, grading, or construction.

In the event that an unpermitted Stormwater discharge does occur off-site, it is a violation of Chapter 90.48 RCW, Water Pollution Control and is subject to enforcement action.
