Dear Ms. Reavis:

The the Department of Archaeology and Historic Preservation (DAHP) has received and completed our review of the report entitled "Cultural Resources Assessment for the Prologis Emerald Gateway Project, King County, Washington." In response, we concur with the results and recommendations made in the survey report, that "that archaeological monitoring be conducted during construction excavations with potential to intersect native soils" (Page 14). We therefore recommend that a professional archaeologist create a Monitoring and Inadvertent Discovery Plan (MIDP) which outlines the parameters for when professional archaeological monitoring will be undertaken, and provide an Inadvertent Discovery Plan for the times when a professional archaeologist is not on site.

The DAHP has no concerns about any of the historic buildings on the property and demolition can proceed. However, the demolition should be included in the MIDP as it generally includes ground disturbance.

We appreciate receiving any correspondence or comments from concerned tribes and other parties that you receive as you consult.

These comments are based on the information available at the time of this review and on behalf of the SHPO pursuant to Washington State law. Please note that should the project scope of work and/or location change significantly, please contact DAHP for further review.
