STATE ENVIRONMENTAL POLICY ACT **DETERMINATION OF NONSIGNIFICANCE**

Proposed Action: Agreed Order No. DE 16297

Description of proposal: The Phillips 66 Ferndale Refinery currently operates an oil refinery in Ferndale, Washington. Ecology is proposing to enter into an agreed order with Phillips 66 requiring Phillips 66 to inspect the integrity of their oily water sewer for releases or potential releases to soil and groundwater. If releases or potential releases are found, Phillips 66 will conduct remedial actions to reduce exposure pathways for waste constituents at the site. Actions include fixing the cause of the release or potential release, excavating contaminated soils where possible, extracting or treating contaminated groundwater, and groundwater monitoring.
