Dear Shane DeGross:

Thank you for expressing BNSF's commitment to perform a full Remedial Investigation (RI) for the sediment cleanup unit at the BNSF Track Switching Facility (Site) as required under the Model Toxics Control Act (MTCA).

I accept the proposal for BNSF to submit an agency review draft of a Sediment RI Work Plan within 90 days. Regarding the work plan design, the Department of Ecology (Ecology) stands by the comments in our letter dated August 13, 2020 as well as our previous letter dated April 21, 2020. We expect that BNSF will create the RI Work Plan to be consistent with the applicable guidance provided in the Sediment Cleanup User's Manual (SCUM), in reference primarily to Chapters 3, 4 and 5.

As you may be aware, MTCA, Chapter 173-340-130 WAC, obligates Ecology to involve tribal governments in the development and implementation of remedial actions. In particular, we have sought the input of the Confederated Tribes and Bands of the Yakama Nation (Yakama Nation) as required under MTCA as well as under an existing Memorandum of Understanding between the State of Washington and the Yakama Nation.
