Thank you for working with the Washington State Department of Ecology (Ecology) on March Point Landfill site (Site). This letter provides written notification that the remedial investigation, feasibility study, and cleanup action plan required at the Site by Agreed Order No. DE-08TCPHQ-5999 (Order) under the Model Toxics Control Act (MTCA), Chapter 70.105D RCW, have been satisfactorily completed. The Order became effective on March 4, 2009. This letter also describes the next steps for the Site.

Completion of Remedial Actions Required by the Order

Ecology has determined the requirements of the Order have been satisfied. Ecology made this determination pursuant to Section IX (Satisfaction of Order).

The remedial actions required by the Order are specified in Section VII (Work to Be Performed). Washington State Department of Natural Resources (DNR) was required to:

- Conduct remedial investigation of the Upland Area and Submerged Land per the approved Phase I Remedial Investigation (RI) Work Plan.
- Provide Phase I RI report to Ecology and conduct a Phase II RI and feasibility study.
- Develop a draft cleanup action plan in cooperation with Ecology.

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After inspecting the Site and reviewing the supporting documentation, Ecology has determined the remedial actions in Section VII have been satisfactorily completed.

Next Steps at the Site

Ecology finalized a Draft Cleanup Action Plan (DCAP) for the Site. After review and consideration of comments received during the public comment period, Ecology issued a final Cleanup Action Plan (CAP).

The CAP will be implemented in a consent decree. DNR opted to not be included in the final consent decree. Instead DNR pursued a separate legal settlement between themselves and the remaining potentially liable persons. Consent decree negotiations are complete with the remaining potentially liable parties.
