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## STATE ENVIRONMENTAL POLICY ACT DETERMINATION OF NONSIGNIFICANCE

Description of proposal:

The proposal associated with this SEPA Environmental Checklist is for performing a cleanup action in accordance with Chapter 70A.305 RCW and WAC 173-340 at the Seattle DOT Dexter Parcel Site (Site). The Site comprises a portion of King County tax parcel number 224900120 (Property) and an adjacent alley located in Seattle's South Lake Union neighborhood. Cleanup will be conducted on the southeast portion of the Property and the eastern portion of the alley where historical gasoline service station operations resulted in environmental releases of petroleum hydrocarbons that have contaminated soil and groundwater.

This cleanup action is being conducted to remediate contaminated soil and groundwater beneath the Property and adjacent alley to meet the cleanup standards established for the Seattle DOT Dexter Parcel cleanup Site. The proposed cleanup action consists of both active and passive remediation elements. Active remediation will include excavation and off-Site disposal of contaminated soil from the Property. Passive remediation will include injection of treatment substances containing oxygen release compound into the alley to enhance *in situ* bioremediation of remaining contamination and performing monitored natural attenuation of groundwater and affected soil in the contaminated smear zone. The cleanup action also includes the following elements:

- Installation of a passive vapor barrier concurrent with construction of a new building on the Property to provide protection from potential vapor intrusion risks while residual contamination remains in the subsurface at concentrations above cleanup levels.
- Implementation of institutional controls to prohibit the use of groundwater as drinking water and to maintain the paved alley and new building slab as a cap while residual contamination remains in the subsurface at concentrations above cleanup levels.
- Compliance monitoring and maintenance activities that include soil and groundwater

sampling and analysis, cap monitoring and maintenance, periodic air monitoring, and long-term groundwater monitoring.
