

Commissioners hear update on jail project

With the recent City of Mount Vernon rezone of the Skagit County Jail site known as "Truck City/Suzanne Lane," Project Manager Marc Estvold delivered an update to the Board of Commissioners at a Monday, April 28 session.

Estvold, who was joined by Sheriff Will Reichardt and design consultant Bill Valdez, briefly reviewed a history of the project for the benefit of the public (see timeline below) before discussing the most recent project developments.

He reported that the programming stage of the project was complete and asked Commissioners to enter into a contract with DLR architectural firm.

Estvold and architect Valdez of DLR estimated it would take 4-6 weeks to

put together the information necessary to begin the public Essential Public Facilities (EPF) process. This process leads to the City's Hearing Examiner before a recommendation goes forward to the City Council. Consideration includes such project elements as landscaping and building elevations.

Reichardt noted plans for a May 7 visit by a Skagit County group to the Cowlitz County Jail, designed by DLR. A site visit was made previously to another DLR designed facility in the Des Moines area (SCORE).
