Dear Mr. Pagano:

The Ecology Northwest Regional office recently modified the state waste discharge permit for the above referenced site. The effective date of this modification is June 20, 2006. When a permit gets modified, the permit fee category classification for the permitted operation is audited to ascertain if a change is warranted. Review of the permit modification shows the wastewater permit fee determination for the upcoming fiscal year 2007 (July 1, 2006 through June 30, 2007) needs to be changed.

Based on information provided to me by Doug Knutson, the permit manager, the annual fee classification will change to reflect the following:

Category: Food Processing
Subcategory 1: H. 750,000 - < 1,000,000 gpd
Subcategory 2:
Permitted Maximum Discharge: 760,000 gpd
Annual Permit Fee: \$ 30,011.00

If you do not agree with the changes made to your permit fee assessment, you may submit an appeal to me stating the reasons you believe the new determination is not consistent with RCW 90.48.465 (enclosed). The department will either issue a
