Dear Mr. Price:

On October 15, 2014, I conducted a Class I (routine) inspection of the Basin City Mobile Home Park Wastewater Treatment Facility. Enclosed is a copy of the inspection report for your records.

I appreciate the time Jon Fox spent going over the document records for the facility, and showing the wastewater treatment operations to me. Also in evidence was Jon's diligence in maintaining facility records and his noteworthy efforts to meet the other permit requirements.

The most important issue identified during the inspection is that the facility is not being operated by a Washington State licensed wastewater operator. The wastewater discharge permit requires that a Class 1 Operator oversee the facility, and without that capacity the facility is out of compliance with the permit. This needs to be remedied immediately. There are two options for gaining compliance:

- 1) Jon Fox, manager, passes the test for Class 1 certification
- 2) A licensed operator is contracted to oversee the operations and sign off on the Discharge Monitoring Reports.

Inspectors Comments:

Ecology permit manager, Llyn Doremus, met with Jon Fox at his home to inspect this facility. At that time we reviewed the document records for the permit, which included:

- Permit and fact sheet
- Discharge monitoring reports
- Laboratory analyses reports
- Operations and Maintenance Manual
- 1997 Engineering Report

Jon informed me that there are 109 sewer hookups and 420 people served by the Basin City Mobile Home Park Wastewater Treatment System. The Waste Load Assessment for 2013 is overdue, and I appreciate you working with our Technical Assistance support staff to get that completed. Thank you for providing copies of the Engineering Report, Operations and Maintenance Manual, and all of last year's DMRs.


Washington requires that wastewater treatment facilities are overseen by a certified operator. Basin City Mobile Home Park must employ a certified Class 1 operator as soon as possible or contract with a certified operator to manage the wastewater treatment operations. Jon Fox is encouraged to get his certification as a Class 1 operator to meet this requirement.

Basin City is encouraged to submit Discharge Monitoring Reports (DMRs) online. I appreciate that Jon has started using the online WebDMR system to submit information. We discussed that for the online DMRs to be valid permit submittals, an electronic signature form signed by the responsible official (Anton Price) must be submitted in paper format to Ecology. A copy of the Electronic Signature Agreement Form is also included with this inspection form.




After reviewing the paper records for the facility we drove to the treatment system. Entering the treatment system from the south, Lagoon No. 4 is the first encountered, which is an evaporation pond. The current depth is at 3.5 feet, with a noticeable odor. The next is Lagoon No. 3 to the north, effluent samples (# 001) are collected from the northwest corner of this lagoon. Lagoon No. 2 is east of Lagoon No. 3. Further to the east of Lagoon No. 2 is Lagoon No. 1, which receives influent flow. The lagoons are operated in sequence. Flows from Lagoon No. 3 are routed either to the evaporation Lagoon No. 4 or to the wetlands.

The lagoons and treatment area surrounding the lagoons appeared to be clean and well maintained at the time of the inspection.






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
