Dear David Huang:

You applied for a Conditional No Exposure (CNE) Exemption on May 14, 2019.

Your CNE Exemption has been granted per the Industrial Stormwater General Permit (ISGP), Special Condition S1.F.1.a: "A Permittee is automatically granted a No Exposure exemption 90 days from Ecology's receipt of a complete and accurate No Exposure Certification Form..."

Your CNE Exemption has been granted starting on the above application date.

Your site was covered under the Industrial Stormwater General Permit, WAR307166. Your permit coverage has been terminated effective May 14, 2019.

If there is a change at the facility that results in the exposure of industrial activities or materials to stormwater, you are required to immediately apply online and obtain general permit coverage. (Industrial Stormwater General Permit Special Condition S1.F.1.d). If you need to apply for a permit, visit <https://ecology.wa.gov/Regulations-Permits/Guidance-technical-assistance/Water-quality-permits-guidance/WQWebPortal-guidance> for application instructions.

Ecology may also conduct a site visit in the future to verify that stormwater is not exposed to pollutants at your site.

Appeal Process

You have a right to appeal Conditional No Exposure Exemption under the general permit to the Pollution Control Hearing Board (PCHB). Appeals must be filed within 30 days of the date of receipt of this letter. Any appeal is limited to the general permit's applicability or non-applicability to a specific discharger. The appeal process is governed by Chapter 43.21B RCW and Chapter 371-08 WAC. "Date of receipt" is defined in RCW 43.21B.001(2).
