Our office has completed review of your August, June, March 2020 Discharge Monitoring Reports (DMRs). The DMRs indicate your discharge did not comply with the effluent limitations and/or monitoring requirements established in your permit. The following was not in compliance:

The August 2020 DMR was due September 15, 2020, it was received September 24, 2020.
The June 2020 DMR was due July 15, 2020, it was received August 17, 2020.
The March 2020 DMR was due April 15, 2020, it was received June 5, 2020.

Your permit requires you to report permit violations. The checked item below indicates if further notification is required regarding the above violation(s).

- No further action is required.
- You must submit a violation report immediately. You have not submitted a violation report for the violations and have not explained the cause of the violations in your DMR, therefore you are in violation of your permit. You may refer to your permit for more information about submitting a violation report.

The effluent limits established in your permit were derived considering the treatment technology employed at your facility, receiving water quality, the environmental impacts of your discharge, and statistical reliability associated with sampling and laboratory procedures.

Compliance Assurance is the goal of the Clean Water Act's self-monitoring program. The DMR is the principle tool used to enforce the self-monitoring program. Be aware of the importance the Department of

Ecology (Department) places on complete and accurate DMRs and the legal implications they have for your facility. Noncompliance with the limits, monitoring requirements, terms and/or conditions established in your permit may result in formal enforcement action by the Department.
