Permit No. WA0032174 has been issued for the discharge of wastewater from Marine Fluid Systems Inc. to waters of the State. This permit is due to expire on March 31, 2023. Federal law and regulation requires an application for renewal of this permit.

Completing the Application

Please use the application EPA forms 1 and 2F from the EPA website at <https://www.epa.gov/npdes/npdes-applications-and-forms> (If you do not have access to a computer, please contact Tricia Miller at (206)594-0167 to request a hard copy.) Also included is Ecology Supplementing form 2C. To allow sufficient time to develop your permit, the completed application must be received at the address below on or before October 1, 2022.

The Ecology permit manager for your facility is Robert Nolan. He has marked below those sections of the application which need to be filled out based upon our understanding of your facility and information which may have already been submitted in an engineering report or other documents. If there have been significant changes to the facility or to the character of the wastewater, you may need to fill in additional sections. Examine all of the questions to see if there are some that are applicable even if they have not been marked. Please submit any additional information that you feel may help Ecology determine the impact of your discharge to surface waters.

Effluent limits for some pollutants are dependent upon the concentration already present in the receiving water. Please submit any available information on the background concentrations of pollutants at the point of discharge.

The application must be signed by either a principal executive officer or ranking elected official (WAC 173-216-070).

Signature authority for submittals required by the permit such as monthly discharge monitoring reports may be delegated to a specific individual or to a position which is expected to be filled by a qualified individual. If you wish to delegate authority, please submit, along with the application, a letter delegating signature authority.

Permit Fees

Fees paid by permit holders support the wastewater permit program (RCW 90.48.465). Ecology regulation (Chapter 173-224 WAC) establishes annual permit fees to recover costs associated with issuing and managing wastewater discharge permits. We will continue to assess and bill annual permit fees to you unless the permit is formally cancelled.
