Re: State Reclaimed Water Permit Renewal Application

Permit Number ST0045498 has been issued to the King County Brightwater Reclaimed Water Plant to regulate the generation, distribution, and use of Class A reclaimed water. This permit is due to expire on April 30, 2024 and requires an application be submitted to Department of Ecology (Ecology). The completed application is to be received at this office by November 1, 2023.

Completing the Application

The Department of Ecology requires you use the State Application Form ECY 070-180 from the Ecology website at <https://apps.ecology.wa.gov/publications/documents/ecy070180.pdf> (If you do not have access to a computer, please contact Tricia Miller at 206-594-0167 to request a hard copy.)

Please use the Checklist at the beginning of the form to ensure the application includes all required supplemental materials.

The permit manager requests that you complete the sections checked below.

- Section B. Reclaimed Water Treatment Systems*
- Section C. Reclaimed Water Distribution* or the following subsections only:
- Section D. Reclaimed Water Use - General*
- Section E. Reclaimed Water Use – Wetlands*

- Section G. Reclaimed Water Use – Groundwater*
- Section H. Groundwater Information*

Please carefully read the instructions on the application form. Submit all information you feel may help Ecology determine the appropriate requirements for your reclaimed water permit. The checklist at the beginning of the form identifies common supplemental information you may need to include with the application.

You may also need to submit information and other applications about the following:

Biosolids

You may also be responsible for compliance with Chapter 173-308 WAC, *Biosolids Management*, and the statewide *General Permit for Biosolids Management*. Solid Waste Handling: You may also be responsible for compliance with Chapter 173-350 WAC, *Solid Waste Handling Standards*, for the management of solid wastes. Please contact your local health jurisdiction with any specific questions.

Groundwater/Receiving Water Analysis: Reclaimed water uses that release water into groundwater or surface water generally require permit conditions necessary to protect those water resources. Submit any available information on the background concentrations of pollutants in the groundwater or surface water near the point where reclaimed water is released to these waters of the state.

Signature Delegation

The application must be signed by a principal executive officer or ranking elected official (Chapter 173-219-190 WAC). Signature authority for submittals required by the permit, such as monthly discharge monitoring reports, may be delegated to a specific individual or to a position which is expected to be filled by a qualified individual. If you wish to delegate authority, please submit a letter delegating signature authority along with the application.

Permit Fees

Ecology regulation (Chapter 173-224 WAC) establishes annual permit fees to recover costs associated with issuing and managing wastewater discharge permits.
