

Facility Description & Background

This facility has been covered under the Fresh Fruit Packing General Permit since 1994. The facility suffered a fire during the last permit term and was rebuilt with upgraded line and equipment. They have two separate buildings and pack lines, one for apples and the new one is for pears. They have a wasteload allocation for heat under the Columbia River Temperature TMDL. They have installed a flow meter on the non-contact cooling water to monitor for heat load per the Columbia River Temperature TMDL. The flow meter was installed earlier this year (2024).

C. Inspection Narrative & Observations

1. Permit Documentation and Records Review

The records and documentation were all in order and at the time of the inspection met permit requirements.

2. Site Walkthrough

The walk through went well. This facility has both a pear packing line and a separate apple packing line. Neither were operational as all staff are working at the cherry packing facility in Dallesport. The engine rooms were running and viewed those and verified the new flow meter. Other than to put spill kit items in labeled containers, at the time of the inspection the facility was in compliance with permit requirements. The facility was exceptionally clean and well organized and maintained.

D. Corrective Actions Required for Compliance

Put the spill kit items into a labeled container. Do this for all engine rooms at both locations.
