### **Enforcement Order Issued for Cleanup Action**

The Washington State Department of Ecology has issued an Enforcement Order requiring the implementation of a Cleanup Action Plan for the Tiger Oil Site located at 2312 West Nob Hill Boulevard in Yakima. The Enforcement Order has been issued to the group of potentially liable parties (PLPs) including Tiger Oil Corporation, Federated Service Insurance Company, M&E Company, and Tiger Oil Company.

### **Site History**

In 1982, 18,772 gallons of petroleum product were released from the underground storage tank system at the Tiger Oil Site. Additional releases of 2,000 gallons and 50 gallons occurred in 1983 and 1984, respectively. The released petroleum product has contaminated the soil, groundwater, and surface water/captured groundwater in the Yakima County Drainage Improvement District storm drain line #4. An interim remediation system, consisting of a groundwater and soil vapor extraction system, was installed in 1995 to prevent off-site migration of petroleum product.

### **Selected Cleanup Action**

The selected cleanup actions for the Tiger Oil Site include underground storage tank removal, petroleum contaminated soil removal, a soil vapor extraction system, and the use of hydrogen peroxide. These actions were selected based on performance criteria

set forth in the Model Toxics Control Act (MTCA) which include:

- protection of human health and the environment
- attainment of cleanup standards
- permanence of cleanup
- reasonable time period for cleanup to be completed
- compliance with other applicable laws

### The Next Step

The PLPs are required to submit plans for implementing the Cleanup Action Plan drafted by Ecology. These plans shall include a Work Plan and Engineering Design Report, which will be made available for public review.
