SCHWERIN CONCAVES, INC. ENFORCEMENT ORDER



The Washington Department of Ecology is issuing Enforcement Order No. 00HWTRER-693 to Schwerin Concaves, Inc. who has been found to be a "potentially liable person" for the hard chromium electroplating facility (Site) on their property located in Walla Walla County, Washington. This Order is issued under requirements set forth in the Model Toxics Control Act (MTCA) Chapter 70.105D RCW.

The Order requires Schwerin Concaves, Inc. to conduct and report on a Remedial Investigation/ Feasibility Study (RI/FS) at the Site. The purpose of the RI/FS is to collect, develop, and evaluate information regarding contamination in affected areas on and off site. The Remedial Investigation will also define the type, extent, and degree of soil and groundwater contamination and the impacts to the affected areas. The Feasibility Study will identify, evaluate and propose alternative cleanup actions. Ecology believes that the RI/FS is necessary to protect human health and the environment in affected areas.

Ecology invites the public to review and comment on the Enforcement Order March 1 through March 31, 2000. The box at the right, as well as information on page two, indicates where these documents may be

SITE BACKGROUND

The Site is located two miles north of Hwy. 12 on Sapolil Road in Walla Walla County, WA. Schwerin Concaves, Inc. has owned and operated a hard chromium electroplating facility on this property from the late 1970s to the present. Contamination of soil and groundwater has been documented at two locations at the Site.

Past wastewater treatment. operations resulted in high levels of hexavalent chromium being deposited in soil from a leaking treatment tank. This tank is located just north of the electroplating shop. Soil contamination to a depth of 24 feet has been documented with the full characterization of this contamination being incomplete. Chromium contamination in soil has also occurred in the area formerly used to store "selfpropelled" equipment. Wastewater and/or wastewater treatment sludge containing chromium was ponded and allowed to evaporate in this area. Contamination of soil to a depth of nine feet has been documented with the full characterization of this

Chromium contamination in groundwater has also occurred at the facility in two drinking water wells. The extent of this groundwater contamination has not been fully characterized.
