SCHWERIN CONCAVES, INC. SITE

PROPOSED INTERIM ACTION and SEPA DNS

The Washington Department of Ecology is proposing to conduct an Interim Action at the Schwerin Concaves, Inc. Site. The Site is a former hard chromium electroplating facility located about four miles north of Hwy. 12 on Sapolil Road in Walla Walla County, Washington.

The proposed Interim Action will include removal and disposal of chromium-contaminated soil from the Site. The decision to remove soil is based on data obtained during the Remedial Investigation/Feasibility Study (RI/FS) activities. Soils at two locations known as the self-propelled area and the plating shop area are believed to be sources for chromium contamination in groundwater. Ecology believes an Interim Action aimed at source control measures is needed to protect human health and the environment in affected areas.

The Site has been identified by Ecology's Toxics Cleanup Program as an orphan site. This means the potentially liable person(s) are either financially unable or unavailable to conduct cleanup in an adequate or timely manner. Therefore, Ecology will use money from the Model Toxics Control Act (MTCA) Chapter 70.105D RCW to complete the Interim Action. Ecology is also proposing to issue a determination of non-significance (DNS) under the State Environmental Policy Act (SEPA, Chapter 197-11 WAC) Rules. An environmental checklist has been completed and this combined with other site-specific information has led Ecology to determine that the Interim Action will not have a probable significant adverse impact on the environment.

Ecology invites the public to review and comment on the proposed Interim Action and SEPA DNS from **October 31 through November 29, 2002.** The box at the right indicates where comments may be sent and additional information found.

SITE BACKGROUND

Schwerin Concaves, Inc. has owned and operated a hard chromium electroplating facility on this property from the late 1970s to the present. Contamination of soil and groundwater has been documented at two locations at the Site.

Releases from a tank formerly used to store and treat wastewater resulted in high levels of hexavalent chromium contamination in soil and groundwater. The tank is located just north of the electroplating shop where soil contamination has been documented as deep as 24 feet. Chromium contamination in soil has also occurred in the area previously used to store "self-propelled" equipment. Wastewater and/or wastewater treatment sludge containing chromium was placed in the self-propelled area and allowed to evaporate. Soil contamination at this location has been documented as deep as nine feet.

Chromium contamination has also been detected in monitoring wells on the site. The extent of the soil and groundwater contamination has not been fully characterized.

WHAT HAPPENS NEXT?

Ecology will review all written comments submitted on the Proposed Interim Action and SEPA DNS and prepare a Responsiveness Summary. The Summary will be available in the repositories listed in the box on page one. If necessary, the documents may be modified.
