#### **Brownfields Redevelopment Workshop Coming to Tacoma in June**

Proposal to Remove Restrictive Covenant from Site – *Unocal 0171 (also known as Unocal Stanwood Former Bulk Plant 0171 and Service Station 4372), Facility Site ID No. 36615236, 8513 Cedarhome Dr., Stanwood, 98292, Snohomish County* 

Ecology is proposing to remove a *Restrictive Covenant* from the Unocal BP 0171 site. The Restrictive Covenant was placed on the property deed last year, because TPH-contaminated ground water remained on site. In order for the site to receive a No Further Action determination from the Voluntary Cleanup Program, a Restrictive Covenant was required to restrict ground water use until cleanup standards were achieved.

Additional sampling conducted throughout 2002 has confirmed that the contamination is now below state cleanup standards. Based on this information, Ecology is proposing to remove the Restrictive Covenant.

Proposed Delisting from Hazardous Sites List Available for Public Review & Comment – Heraldo Residence, Facility Site ID No. 5991749, 8856 16<sup>th</sup> Avenue SW, Seattle, 98106, King County

Ecology is *proposing to remove* the Heraldo Residence site from its Hazardous Sites List. The site is ranked "2" on the list. A rank of "1" is the highest level of concern compared to other sites on the list, and a rank of "5" is the lowest.

Cleanup of the site involved removing and treating 27 tons of petroleum-contaminated soil and approximately 500 pounds of chromium- and lead-contaminated soil.

Based on a review of cleanup reports and sampling results, Ecology has determined the site is not a threat to human health and the environment and is recommending removing the site from the Hazardous Sites List.

# Draft Engineering Design Report Available for Public Review & Comment – Yakima Valley Spray, Facility Site ID No. 445, 1108 S. 1<sup>st</sup> St., Yakima, 98901, Yakima County

The *Engineering Design Report* for the Yakima Valley Spray site is available for public review and comment through June 16, 2003. This report provides engineering concepts and design criteria that will be used for designing the cleanup action. The report also contains a Storm Water Pollution Prevention Plan, Sampling and Analysis Plan, Health and Safety Plan, and Ground Water Compliance Monitoring Plan.

The Yakima Valley Spray site is contaminated with 62 contaminants underlying the soil and ground water. The main contaminants of concern include arsenic, PCE (a solvent), gasoline, diesel, oil, benzene, and pesticides (aldrin, dieldrin, DDD). The cleanup action will include the following:

- Monitoring air during construction planned for winter of 2003-2004;
- Sampling and demolition/removal of two on-site buildings;
- Excavating and disposing of large pesticide pit;
- Excavating and disposing of total petroleum hydrocarbon (TPH) pit(s);
- Backfilling excavated pits;
- Bioventing/biosparging remaining PCE/TPH contamination;
- Replacing destroyed monitoring wells and installing five new monitoring wells;
- Monitoring ground water for five years;
- Placing institutional controls to limit use of site to commercially-zoned purposes and to restrict use of site ground water.
