## **Agreed Order Documents Available for Public Review and Comment – I&J Waterway Site, Bellingham, Whatcom County**

Ecology and the Port of Bellingham (Port) are **proposing an Agreed Order to implement a Remedial Investigation/Feasibility Study** at I&J Waterway (Site).

The I&J Waterway site is located between Hilton Avenue and Bellwether Way on the Bellingham waterfront. The Site consists of contaminated marine sediments located within the I&J Waterway and the nearby ship berthing areas. Between the early 1900's and 1940, Whatcom Falls Mill Company owned the upland and berth areas and operated a lumber mill in that location. In 1944, the Port acquired ownership of the upland and berth areas and began leasing the property to a variety of industrial tenants. Bayshore Lumber operated a lumber mill at the head of the waterway from 1947 to 1962, and H&H Products managed the same mill from 1963 to 1972. From 1963 to 1992, Olivine Corporation operated a rock crushing plant for the mineral olivine which periodically released dust and wastewater into the waterway. North Pacific Frozen Products managed a frozen foods processing plant between 1946 and 1959, and between 1959 and the present, Bornstein Seafoods has operated a seafood processing facility. The Bornstein building was destroyed by a fire in 1985 and rebuilt in the same location.

Previous environmental investigations of the Site indicate the presence of hazardous substances in the surface sediments above state cleanup standards including phthalate compounds, polynuclear aromatic hydrocarbon compounds, and phenol compounds. Elevated levels of mercury associated with the Whatcom Waterway site and elevated levels of methylphenol compounds associated with on-site or off-site activities are also present in the Site subsurface sediments.

The I&J Waterway site is one of several cleanup sites being addressed as part of the Bellingham Bay Demonstration Pilot; a bay-wide, multi-agency initiative integrating sediment cleanup, control of pollution sources, habitat restoration and aquatic/shoreline land use.

## ☐ **Cadet Manufacturing Cleanup Progress**

### **You are invited to attend a public meeting Oct. 27, 2004**

The Washington State Department of Ecology (Ecology) will hold a public meeting October 27 from 7 to 9 p.m. about cleanup progress at the Cadet Manufacturing site, and the Fruit Valley Neighborhood. Representatives from Cadet Manufacturing and its consultant, AMEC Earth and Environmental, Inc. will be present.

The meeting will be at the Fruit Valley Neighborhood (FVN) Community Center, 3203 Unander Ave., Vancouver.

The meeting will begin with an Open House. A presentation begins at 7:30 and will be followed by a question and answer session.

Large posters will show the extent of contamination and techniques used for cleanup. Groundwater and soil contamination in the FVN are the focus of the cleanup. Cleanup actions include:

- Cleaning up soil and groundwater contamination at the Cadet Manufacturing site;
- Installing and monitoring wells to treat contaminated groundwater beneath FVN and Cadet site;
- Installation of soil vacuum systems in homes to prevent solvent vapor movement into indoor air.

Groundwater is not used for drinking in the area and the Washington Department of Health has determined there is no immediate threat to human health.

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## ☐ **Proposed Interim Cleanup Action and State Environmental Policy Act (SEPA) Determination Available for Public Review and Comment - Evergreen Infiltration Range, Fort Lewis, Washington**

Ecology is proposing an Interim Cleanup Action for the Evergreen Infiltration Range located within Fort Lewis south of Interstate 5 adjacent to Evergreen Avenue. The Evergreen Infiltration Range was formerly used to conduct live fire military training with fixed machine guns firing into a berm. The berm is now highly contaminated with lead including lead bullet fragments.

The proposed interim cleanup action consists of excavating soils from the berm that contain concentrations of lead above the MTCA soil cleanup standard. Lead bullet fragments will then be removed from the excavated soils followed by stabilizing the remaining soils. The treated soils will then be transported to active firing ranges where they will be used as berm material.

Ecology has determined the proposed interim cleanup described in the “Interim Cleanup Action Plan, Evergreen Infiltration Range” will not have an adverse impact on the environment and has issued a SEPA DNS.

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### ☐ **Public Comment Period for Proposed Cleanup and Order Amendment at Boeing’s Renton, Washington Plant**

Ecology invites public comment on a proposed amendment to the Agreed Order No. DE 97HZ-N233. This order implements corrective action at the Boeing Renton Plant to satisfy the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (RCRA). Ecology also invites the public to comment on an interim cleanup action on the property.

The Boeing Company (Boeing) intends to sell a portion of their Renton Plant. The Agreed Order will change this property’s boundaries and remove three areas of concern (AOC) near Building 10-52 from the Agreed Order. These areas of concern are located on the property Boeing intends to sell and Boeing is responsible for this area’s cleanup before and after the property is sold.

The interim cleanup action will remove petroleum-contaminated soils from this area. Ecology has determined that this interim action will create no significant adverse impacts to the environment. Therefore, Ecology recommends a State Environmental Policy Act (SEPA) determination of non-significance (DNS) for this activity.

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**☐ Draft Consent Decree Available for Public Review & Comment – South Wilbur Petroleum Contamination Site, Wilbur, Lincoln County, WA**

The Site consists of three properties: the Washington State Department of Transportation (WSDOT) and Lincoln County Maintenance Facilities; which have both been in operation since the early 1930s, and the former Lincoln Mutual #3 fueling station; which operated from the 1960s through the 1980s. The WSDOT facility was closed in 1996. These parties have been identified as responsible for contamination at the site. However, Lincoln Mutual #3 and WSDOT have declined to sign the Consent Decree.

The Consent Decree is a legal document that formalizes the agreement between Ecology and Lincoln County to cleanup petroleum contamination in soil and groundwater at the site. Contamination is a result of fueling activities that have taken place since the early 1930s.

Ecology has selected source removal with engineering controls and enhanced bioremediation for the remedial action. The preferred cleanup action includes:

- Removing contaminated soil and treating it off-site;
- Backfilling excavated areas with a mix of clean fill and an oxygen releasing compound;
- Installing a phytoremediation barrier on the north and west sides of the site, and engineering controls (including asphalt pavement, and stormwater controls); and
- Using institutional controls, which are restrictions used to maintain the integrity of the cleanup action. A Restrictive Covenant is included as an exhibit to the decree. This document provides a legal description of the property and limits groundwater and land use.

Ecology and Kimberly-Clark Corporation are proposing an agreed order to conduct a Remedial Investigation/Feasibility Study for both upland and marine areas of the southern portion of the former Scott Paper Mill site. The work is to be conducted in conjunction with work conducted on the northern portion of the site under a separate consent decree.

Pulp milling and other operations at the site resulted in contamination that includes wood and sulfur waste in soil, metals and petroleum hydrocarbons in soil and groundwater, and polychlorinated biphenyls (PCBs) in sediments.

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**☐ Agreed Order Documents Available for Public Review and Comment – Cornwall Avenue Landfill Site, Bellingham, 98225, Whatcom County**

Ecology, the Port of Bellingham (Port), and the City of Bellingham (City) are proposing an Agreed Order to implement a Remedial Investigation/Feasibility Study at the former Cornwall Avenue Landfill site (Site).

The Cornwall Avenue Landfill site is approximately eight-acres in size and is located at the south end of Cornwall Avenue, adjacent to Bellingham Bay. Most of the Site was originally tide flats and sub-tidal areas of Bellingham Bay. From 1888 to 1946, the Site was used for sawmill operations, including log storage and wood disposal. From 1946 to 1965, the Port held the lease on the state-owned land, subleasing the property to the City from 1953 to 1962. The City used the Site for municipal waste disposal. In 1962, the City entered into a lease with another Port tenant (American Fabricators) who continued waste disposal operations at the Site until 1965. Landfill operations ended at the Site in 1965, and a soil layer was placed on top of the municipal waste.

Previous environmental investigations of the Site indicate the presence of hazardous substances in groundwater, surface water, soil and/or sediments above state cleanup standards, including arsenic, copper, lead, mercury, silver, zinc, cyanide, polychlorinated biphenyls (PCB), bis (2-ethylhexyl) phthalate, polycyclic aromatic hydrocarbon (PAH) compounds and fecal coliform.

The Site is one of several cleanup sites identified in the Bellingham Bay Comprehensive Strategy, a bay-wide guidance document issued in 2000. The Comprehensive Strategy integrates sediment cleanup, control of pollution sources, habitat restoration and aquatic/shoreline land use on a bay-wide scale.

## **□ Site Hazard Assessment**

*If it is determined that further work is required at a site after an initial investigation, a site hazard assessment (SHA) may be conducted at the site that provides Ecology with basic information about the site. With that information, the Washington Ranking Method is used to estimate the potential threat the site poses, if not cleaned up, to human health and the environment.*

*Site hazard assessments will be conducted on the below-named sites. Their hazard ranking or determination of No Further Action (NFA) will be published in the special edition of the August 2004 Site Register, the Hazardous Sites List.*
