The Department of Ecology is proposing to issue a general permit to cover Concentrated Animal Feeding Operations (CAFO). The old dairy general permit will expire in March 2005. The Department of Ecology has revised the permit and is proposing to reissue the permit on March 2, 2005.

You are invited to review and comment on the draft permit and fact sheet from December 1, 2004 to January 28, 2005. The Department of Ecology will host four workshops and public hearings on its proposed permit.

Workshops and Hearings

The purpose of the workshops is to explain the general permit and answer your questions. The purpose of the hearings is to provide an opportunity for you to give formal comments on the proposed permit. All workshops will begin at 6 p.m. and the hearings will follow the workshop.

Purpose of the General Permit

The proposed general permit covers discharges of waste water from CAFOs to waters of Washington State. Under federal and state water quality law, a permit is required for the discharge of wastewater. The permit requires CAFOs to develop a nutrient management plan to manage their manure. It also requires CAFOs to store and use manure in a way that will protect water quality.

Issuing the Final CAFO General Permit

The Department of Ecology will issue the final permit after it considers all public comments. If you comment on the draft permit, the Department of Ecology will send a response to you when it issues the final permit.


