# Gilbert and Robertson Elementary Schools Yakima, Washington

# **Interim Remedial Action and SEPA Determination of Non-Significance**

The Washington State Department of Ecology (Ecology) is providing an opportunity for the public to comment on the Interim Remedial Action Plan and the issuance of a Determination of Non-Significance (DNS) for the soil cleanups at two elementary schools in Yakima, Washington. Gilbert Elementary School is located at 4400 Douglas Drive and Robertson Elementary School is located at 2807 West Lincoln Avenue.

#### Site History

Soil beneath the grass on the playgrounds at the two elementary schools contains lead and arsenic. The lead and arsenic likely comes from the use of these chemicals as orchard pest sprays in the early and mid  $20^{\text{th}}$  century.

#### Sampling

Sampling and analysis indicate that concentrations exceed state cleanup levels for lead and arsenic. Ecology has considered several alternatives for cleanup.

#### **Cleanup Action**

The alternative preferred by Ecology at both schools consists primarily of excavating and hauling some soil away for disposal at a permitted landfill, mixing remaining soil to reduce peak lead and arsenic levels, placing clean soil on top of the existing soil, and establishing new grass in this clean soil. Ecology has determined that this alternative will provide the necessary barrier to prevent human exposure to lead and arsenic. At each school, the plan includes installation of an irrigation system to maintain the turf grass cover.

#### **Determination of Non-Significance**

After reviewing the State Environmental Policy Act (SEPA) environmental checklist, Ecology has determined that the cleanup action will not have a probable adverse impact on the environment and an Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) is not required. The checklist may be reviewed at the location listed in the information box on the right.
