Negotiations for a Consent Decree

Ecology and the Bonneville Conservation and Restoration Team (on behalf of Clark County and the Trust for Public Lands) are negotiating a prospective purchaser

consent decree to conduct a cleanup at the Camp Bonneville Military Reservation. Negotiations began on December 19, 2005 and are expected to end by March 31, 2006. The site has:

- Diesel fuel, fuel oil, pesticides, and xylenes in the soil;
- Volatile organic compounds, including 1,1,1-trichloroethane in the soil and ground water;
- Military munitions used or disposed of at the site, including explosives, unexploded ordnance (UXO), munitions, and munitions fragments in the soil.
- The constituents of those military munitions, including the explosive compound RDX (which is shorthand for Royal Demolition Explosive, sometimes referred to as Research Demolition Explosive), in the soil and ground water. This includes the presence of the chemical perchlorate in the groundwater beneath Landfill 4.

Chemical byproducts of gasoline (gasoline range petroleum hydrocarbons) have been found in the site's soil and groundwater. These byproducts pose a potential hazard to human health and the environment.

Under the state's Model Toxics Control Act (MTCA, Chapter 70.105D RCW), previous and current owners and operators of a contaminated property are responsible for cleanup of the contamination. The Agreed Order will require the Kims and M&TK, Inc. to complete an investigation of site contamination and a feasibility study of possible cleanup actions, and develop a clean up plan.

Agreed Order

Ecology seeks public comment on a proposed Agreed Order with Bryan M. and Kathleen R. Kolb for the Brumfield Twidwell site.

An Open House will be held March 2, 6:30 to 8:30 p.m. at Montesano City Hall. The public will have an opportunity to ask questions and/or provide comment at the Open House.

Chemical byproducts of gasoline (gasoline range petroleum hydrocarbons) have been found in the site's soil and groundwater. These byproducts pose a potential hazard to human health and the environment. Past use of the property has included automobile dealerships and service stations that sold gasoline and diesel fuels.

Under the state's Model Toxics Control Act (MTCA, Chapter 70.105D RCW), previous and current owners of a contaminated property are responsible

for cleanup of the contamination. As the current owner, the Kolbs are responsible for cleanup of the soil and groundwater contamination on the Brumfield Twidwell property.

The Kolbs have already done some work to remove contaminated soils from the site, but more is needed. The agreed order describes how the Kolbs will:

- Conduct an investigation of the contamination.
- Study the feasibility of cleanup alternatives.
- Develop a cleanup action plan.
- Partner with Ecology to keep the community well-informed as the work moves forward.

The investigation will take into account what has already been learned about the site, and include additional work to determine the full nature and distribution of contamination.

Public Meeting to be Held - February 7, 2006

Public Comment period extended through 2/15/06

Agreed order

Ecology will hold a public meeting on Tuesday, February 7, 2006, to discuss a proposed agreed order amendment that will address infrastructure for a

contingent groundwater treatment system for the Landsburg Mine site.

A public comment period was held on the proposed agreed order amendment and State Environmental Policy Act (SEPA) document last October 20 to November 18, 2005. During the comment period, community members requested a public meeting to discuss the proposed interim action. In response to these requests, Ecology will hold a public meeting on February 7, 2006, 7:00-9:00 p.m., at the Tahoma Junior High School, 25600 Summit Landsburg Road, Ravensdale, WA 98051.

The Landsburg Mine site is a former underground coal mine located approximately 1.5 miles northwest of Ravensdale in southeast King County. The site is located directly south and east of the S.E. Summit-Landsburg Road and north of the Kent-Kangley Road.

During the late 1960s and early 1970s, the northern part of the trench was used as a disposal site for a variety of organic and inorganic industrial wastes. This included paint waste, polychlorinated biphenyls (PCBs), cyanide, metals, and oily sludge. A Remedial Investigation/ Feasibility Study to determine the nature and extent of contamination and also evaluate cleanup options was completed in 1996. Interim ground water monitoring is being conducted at the site, and a deep (700 feet) monitoring well has recently been installed at the former mine's southern interior. No ground water contamination has been found at the site.

BNSF Railroad Company Skykomish Site-Levee Zone, Skykomish

Public comment period: 1/13/06 – 2/3/06

Interim Action, Public Review & Comment, Public Workshops, State Environmental Policy Act (SEPA) Scoping and early review of draft Engineering Design Report

Ecology proposes to begin cleanup of the site with an Interim Action for the Levee Zone by excavating contaminated sediments and soil and replacing them with clean fill. This proposal includes temporarily relocating 5 homes and people.

A maintenance and fueling facility operated in Skykomish from the early 20th Century until 1974. Over the decades bunker-C and diesel fuel oil were discharged to the environment on the railyard. The oil flowed downward to the water table, and thence horizontally along the water table under the Town of Skykomish to the South Fork of the Skykomish River.

Seasonal fluctuation of the water table has resulted in the oil being smeared in soils across the zone of fluctuation. Sediments in the river are contaminated with oil. Free product occurs at the ground water table, and ground water contains dissolved oil constituents. Oil continues to seep into the Skykomish River at present.

The railroad is owned by BNSF Railway Company. BNSF and Ecology have been investigating the site since 1993.

A Remedial Investigation/Feasibility Study (RI/FS) was completed on the site in 2005. Concurrent with this Interim Action, Ecology is writing a Cleanup Action Plan (CAP) for the entire site.

Ecology has determined that this proposal will likely have a significant adverse impact on the environment and community. Even though there will be temporary, short-term adverse impacts from this action, the overall cleanup will have beneficial results for both the environment and community.

Ecology would like your comments on the scope of the Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) for cleaning up the Levee Zone.

Supplemental Interim Action Work Plan, Amended Agreed Order, and State of Washington Dangerous Waste Management Permit for Corrective Action

Ecology seeks public comment on the proposed Supplemental Interim Action Work Plan, Amended Agreed Order, and State of Washington Dangerous Waste Management Permit for Corrective Action.

On December 16, 2005, the Boeing Company (Boeing) sold parcels 8, 9, and 12 ("Area 1 Property") of their Boeing Auburn Plant to the AMB Property Corporation (AMB).

Prior to selling the Area 1 Property to AMB, Boeing implemented an interim action to remediate a release of solvent that occurred from a former vapor degreaser into groundwater. Trichloroethene, and Vinyl Chloride are two of the contaminants that were detected in groundwater beneath and surrounding the Area 1 Property. As part of the interim action, Boeing installed injection wells and added monitoring wells to their groundwater monitoring network. A non-toxic media was introduced to the source area of the contamination. This was done on three separate occasions to enhance the process of reductive dechlorination of the source contamination. Currently, the Boeing Company is conducting compliance monitoring in accordance with the Model Toxics Control Act, WAC 173-303-410 in order to determine whether the interim action has been successful in reducing and maintaining the levels of source area contaminants in groundwater below target levels.

Because the AMB Property Corporation will demolish Boeing's vacated "Building 17-05" and reconstruct a

larger building on the Area 1 Property, the injection wells and groundwater monitoring wells on site will need to be abandoned. Groundwater monitoring wells will need to be re-installed once construction of the new building is at a stage which will allow this to occur.

Therefore, to ensure that the compliance monitoring currently taking place on the Area 1 Property continues, and in case additional remediation is needed in the future, Ecology has requested that Boeing propose a Supplemental Interim Action Work Plan to incorporate additional requirements for abandoning and re-installing specific groundwater monitoring wells. Additionally, Ecology proposes to modify the Agreed Order implementing RCRA Corrective Action for the Auburn Plant to incorporate the supplemental interim action work plan and to add the AMB Property Corporation as a Potentially Liable Party (PLP) to the Agreed Order. Finally, Ecology proposes to issue a Dangerous Waste Management Permit for Corrective Action to both the Boeing Company and the AMB Property Corporation. The new permit, that will replace the RCRA Permit issued in August 1987, will reflect the current generator status at the Auburn Plant and incorporate the amended agreed order, now called the First Amended Agreed Order No. 01HWTRNR-3345.

Lehigh Cement Company, Closed Cement Kiln Dust (CKD) Pile, State Route 31 (Highway 31), Milepost 14.7, Metaline Falls

Public comment period: 1/25/06 – 2/24/06

Draft Cleanup Action Plan, SEPA DNS and Consent Decree

Lehigh owned and operated a cement processing plant from 1914 until the plant was closed in 1989. Cement kiln dust, a by-product of cement processing was collected from the plant and disposed of in a landfill on-site. Contamination in water underneath and downgradient of the landfill is a result of the interaction between the cement kiln dust and groundwater. In 1996 Lehigh closed the CKD landfill, and it is now known as the Closed CKD Pile. Groundwater continues to be contaminated, is highly alkaline (high pH) and contains arsenic, chromium, lead and manganese.

The purpose of the Draft Cleanup Action Plan is to evaluate and select proposed cleanup options at the site. The proposed cleanup actions for the site are:

- Installing, operating and maintaining an in-situ (in place) groundwater treatment system east of the Closed CKD Pile between State Route 31 and Sullivan Creek.
- Installing, operating, and maintaining a gravity drain along the southern edge of the Closed CKD Pile.
- Monitoring to assess performance of the treatment system.

• Applying and maintaining institutional controls. Institutional controls are measures to limit or prohibit activities at the site that could interfere with maintaining the cleanup once it is completed. Fences, signs, and a restrictive covenant on the property are required. A restrictive covenant shows the type and location of contamination on the property and limits how the property may be used.

The State Environmental Policy Act (SEPA) requires government agencies to consider potential impacts of a project before cleanup. After review of an environmental checklist and other site-specific information, Ecology has determined the cleanup of metals and alkaline (high pH) in groundwater will not have a probable adverse impact on the environment. This action will benefit the environment by reducing the release of toxic chemicals from the site. Therefore, Ecology has issued a Determination of Non-Significance (DNS).

The Consent Decree is a legal document that formalizes the cleanup between Ecology and the Leigh Cement Company. The decree implements the groundwater cleanup action for the site and ensures cleanup will proceed in accordance with all applicable laws and regulations. After the public comment period, the decree becomes final and is entered into Superior Court.

Draft Remedial Investigation Report Available for Review and Comment

Schwerin Concaves, Inc. is located approximately four miles north of Hwy. 12 on Sapolil Road in Walla Walla County, WA. Schwerin Concaves, Inc. owned and operated an electroplating facility on this property from the late 1970s to the present. Chromium contamination in soil and groundwater has been documented at the site as a result of the electroplating operations.

The purpose of the remedial investigation (RI) was to collect, develop, and evaluate information regarding contamination on-and off-site. The RI also defined the type, location, and quantity of contamination in soil and groundwater. The RI confirmed chromium in soil and groundwater in concentrations that exceed state cleanup levels. An interim action was conducted to remove contaminated soil from the plating shop and self-propelled shed areas.

As part of the RI, soil and groundwater were evaluated for arsenic, cadmium, chromium, hexavalent chromium, lead and zinc. Groundwater was also evaluated for volatile organic compounds, but they were not detected. Sampling results indicate chromium continues to be present in groundwater. Additional sampling and monitoring are continuing at the Site. A feasibility study will be conducted to evaluate alternatives for Site cleanup.

When a property owner applies to Ecology for review of their independent cleanup, the site enters the Voluntary Cleanup Program. After review, Ecology sends a letter to the property owner stating either that additional work is required to be removed from the list of hazardous waste sites or that no further action is needed.

Data Submittal Requirements for All Cleanup Sites

Toxics Cleanup Program Policy (as of October, 2005):

Environmental sampling data for all cleanup sites must be submitted both in printed and electronic form. (The legal basis for this requirement is established in Chapter 173-340-840(5) RCW.) at http://apps.leg.wa.gov/WAC/default.aspx?cite=173-340.

Policy 840 (http://www.ecy.wa.gov/programs/tcp/policies/tcppoly.html Click on 840.) directs Ecology staff to take certain actions to implement these data submittal requirements. Failure to properly submit data may result in Ecology regarding the submittal as incomplete.

Most Cleanup Sites:

Sampling data should be submitted in EIM (Environmental Information Management) system format. The EIM system is Ecology's main repository for electronic environmental monitoring data. It is intended to provide an

accessible means by which to examine and evaluate environmental monitoring data. The EIM system now includes a robust toolset to allow internal staff, contractors, and citizens to search for data either via a map interface, or for a specific study or result set.
