Public comment period: 2/22/06 – 3/24/06

Proposed Delisting From Hazardous Sites List

Ecology is proposing to remove the Simplot Soilbuilders site from its Hazardous Sites List. The site is currently ranked a "4" on the list. A rank of "1" is the highest level of concern compared to other sites on the list, and a rank of "5" is the lowest.

The site has been used as a pesticide, herbicide, and fertilizer distributor since the late 1960s. Chemical handling at the facility has generally consisted of large numbers of small quantity containers (i.e. 1-30 gallon or 10-100 pound containers).

In 1989, Ecology conducted a site investigation at the property that indicated the presence of trace amounts of five pesticides including: Aldrin, Dieldrin, DDT, DDE and DDD. These pesticides were detected at maximum concentrations of 25 to 732 parts per billion. Cleanup levels were exceeded slightly for Aldrin and Dieldrin.

The areas of concern identified in the Ecology investigation include: the equipment rinsing area, the former above ground Telone tank location and a stained area along the railroad tracks. In addition, samples were collected from an on-site domestic water supply well and analyzed for pesticides, herbicides, and fertilizer byproducts.

In 1990, the site owner contracted SEACOR to conduct additional investigation at the areas of concern. Additional soil samples were collected from the three areas of concern as well as additional groundwater samples from the water supply well.

Soil and groundwater samples collected by SEACOR did not detect any of the contaminants of concern (including the five pesticides detected in the Ecology investigation) above laboratory detection limits. Laboratory detection limits were less than Model Toxics Control Act Method B cleanup levels for the contaminants of concern.

Based upon a review of sampling reports, Ecology has determined the site is no longer a threat to human health and the environment and has recommended removing the site from the Hazardous Sites List.

Boise White Paper, 907 W 7th Street, Vancouver

Public comment period: 3/17/06 – 4/17/06

Draft Agreed Order and

Public Meeting April 4, 2006

Ecology proposes to issue an Agreed Order to Boise White Paper, LLC (Boise). The Order lists tasks Boise must perform to explore and define the extent of oil contamination on its property (site) in Vancouver, Washington. It also requires Boise to determine whether onsite activities or off-site sources caused the contamination. Boise must complete the work defined by the Agreed Order within two months of the date the Order takes effect.

After Boise fulfills its duty under the Agreed Order, and pays the costs of cleanup, Boise will be excused from an obligation to deal with suspected oil contamination discovered at the site later. However, if the work Boise performs under the Order shows that the contamination came from on-site operations, Boise or previous site owners will have to pay investigation and cleanup costs.

The site was developed for industrial use (as a saw mill and lumber finishing plant) by at least 1911. By 1928, it became the Columbia River Paper Company, making pulp and paper products. The Boise Cascade Corporation assumed owner ship of the facility in the 1960's.

Boise Cascade ceased making pulp at the site in 1970. And in 1996 it also stopped making paper from purchased pulp. From 1996 to 2006, its operations included paper converting (cutting and coating paper for a specific enduser); limited printing services; and rolled paper packaging, storage, and distribution. In October 2004, Boise Cascade Corporation sold the Vancouver facility to Boise White Paper, LLC.

A Phase 1- Environmental Assessment completed in July 2004 tagged seven areas for potential study at the site. Using the Phase I study as guidance, a Phase II - Site Investigation completed in May 2005, identified fifteen areas of interest (AOI) for more detailed investigation. After soil and water sampling, eleven of the fifteen AOI were deemed safe by MTCA cleanup standards. Four AOIs needed fiuther investigation.

Ecology will weigh the merits of all comments received on or before April 17, 2006. If persuaded by those comments, Ecology will modify the proposed Agreed Order and issue the final version. Ecology expects Boise to complete the work required by the Agreed Order within two months of the Order's eflective date. When Ecology proposes a Cleanup Action Plan for the site, we will again request public review and formal comment on that plan.

Negotiations for a Consent Decree

Ecology and the Bonneville Conservation and Restoration Team (on behalf of Clark County and the Trust for Public Lands) are negotiating a prospective purchaser consent decree to conduct a cleanup at the Camp Bonneville Military Reservation. Negotiations began on December 19, 2005 and are expected to end by March 31, 2006. The site has:

- Diesel fuel, fuel oil, pesticides, and xylenes in the soil;
- Volatile organic compounds, including 1,1,1-trichloroethane in the soil and ground water;
- Military munitions used or disposed of at the site, including explosives, unexploded ordnance (UXO), munitions, and munitions fragments in the soil.

The constituents of those military munitions, including the explosive compound RDX (which is shorthand for Royal Demolition Explosive, sometimes referred to as Research Demolition Explosive), in the soil and ground water. This includes the presence of the chemical perchlorate in the groundwater beneath Landfill 4.

BNSF Skykomish Site (Former Fuel and Maintenance Facility), Levee Zone, Skykomish

Public comment period: 3/3/06 – 4/3/06

Public Meeting - Interim Action for cleanup of the Levee Zone

Ecology proposes to begin cleanup of the site with an Interim Action for the Levee Zone by excavating contaminated sediments and soil and replacing them with clean fill. This proposal includes temporarily relocating 5 homes and people.

A maintenance and fueling facility operated in Skykomish from the late 1890s until 1974. Over the decades bunker-C and diesel fuel oil were discharged to the environment on the railyard. The oil flowed downward to the water table, and then horizontally along the water table under the Town of Skykomish to the South Fork of the Skykomish River.

Seasonal changes in the depth of the water table have resulted in the oil being smeared in soils across the groundwater column. Sediments in the river are contaminated with oil. Free product occurs at the ground water table, and ground water contains dissolved oil constituents. Oil continues to seep into the Skykomish River at present.

The railroad is owned by BNSF Railway Company (BNSF). BNSF and Ecology have been investigating the site since 1993. Remedial Investigation Studies and a Feasibility Study (RI/FS) were completed on the site and accepted by Ecology in 2005. Ecology is writing a Cleanup Action Plan (CAP) for the entire site as this Interim Action proceeds.

Ecology would like review and comments on the draft documents relating to this Interim Action. The documents are:

- Public Participation Plan.
- Environmental Impact Statement.

Proposed Consent Decree

Natural Resource Trustees and United States v. Ryder System, Inc.

A proposed consent decree in United States v. United States v. Ryder System, Inc., Civil Action No. C06–5072RJB,

has been lodged with the United States District Court for the Western District of Washington. The consent decree requires defendant Ryder System, Inc., to compensate natural resource trustees for natural resource damages in Commencement Bay, Washington,

resulting from releases of hazardous substances. The trustees are the State of Washington (Ecology), the Puyallup Tribe of Indians, the Muckleshoot Indian Tribe, the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration of the United States Department of Commerce, and the United States Department of the Interior. Under the consent decree, defendants will pay \$25,838.61 for natural resource damages and assessment costs.

Proposed Delisting from Hazardous Sites List

Ecology is proposing to remove the J.C. Penney / Banks Property Site from its Hazardous Sites List. The site is currently ranked a "3" on the list. A rank of "1" is the highest level of concern compared to other sites on the list, and a rank of "5" is the lowest.

Until 1983, the property was known as the J.C. Penney Automotive Parts and Service Center and was owned by Mr. Robert Banks. The current owner of the property is JEM Naches LLC. Contaminants found at the property from a sample taken from stockpiled soil during August 1992, include PCE, methylene chloride and petroleum. This excavated soil came from a tank excavation.

J.C. Penney conducted a Remedial Investigation (RI) at the site under an Agreed Order. These efforts included soil sampling as well as groundwater sampling. The RI results indicate that site specific hazardous substances of concern are NOT present at the site at levels which may be a threat to human health or the environment. Also, Ecology and J.C. Penney agree that the Banks Property is not a source of PCE in the groundwater within the site. Based on these facts, Ecology has determined that the release or potential release of hazardous substances at the Banks Property has been resolved.

Ecology has determined the site is no longer a threat to human health and the environment and has recommended removing the site from the Hazardous Sites List.

Restructuring of the Voluntary Cleanup Program (VCP)

As part of the restructuring of VCP, Ecology plans to send a letter on April 1st 2006, to VCP applicants who have not received any services from Ecology for the past 12 months. Ecology will ask whether VCP applicants wish to remain in the VCP as "active" sites. For those VCP applicants where Ecology receives no reply or receives a reply that the VCP applicant is no longer interested in Ecology's assistance under VCP, Ecology will send out notices on May 1 indicating that the VCP account is being closed, thereby terminating any agreement for services. Refunds will be made to those terminated VCP accounts that have a balance from the \$500 deposits.

On June 1st 2006, Ecology plans to complete the termination of all inactive sites and will send out new Contract Agreements to all active sites that wish to remain in the VCP. On July 1st 2006 Ecology expects all active and new VCP sites to come under the new Contract Agreement. The new Contract Agreement will clarify expectations under the restructured VCP; provide billing information; explain a

signing party's responsibility for paying Ecology's costs; and identify the costs that are recoverable under VCP.

A new, automated billing system is under development so that billing will occur in a more frequent cycle. Therefore, opinion letters, including No Further Action letters, can be released sooner than is currently practiced. Under the new contract and billing system, Ecology will no longer require the \$500 deposits.

Catalog of Formal Oversight Decision Documents, Orders and Decrees

The Toxics Cleanup Program maintains a list of all formal oversight decision documents under the Model Toxics Control Act. A new public feature on the Program's website contains a list of the administrative documents for Ecology-conducted or Ecologysupervised remedial actions. This list identifies all formal agreements where the Toxics Cleanup Program has issued enforcement orders or entered into consent decrees---including prospective purchaser consent decrees---and agreed orders. The purpose of this list is to provide potentially liable persons and prospective purchasers with a repository of information on the administrative decisions for cleanup at a site.
