Draft Agreed Order, Draft Sediment Evaluation Work Plan, and Draft Public Participation Plan Available for Public Review and Comment

Ecology requests your input on three documents: draft Agreed Order, draft Sediment Evaluation Work Plan, and draft Public Participation Plan. These documents are for the proposed investigation of contamination in the shoreline, near shore sediments, seeps, and storm water for the 8801 East Marginal Way South site. This site is located along the east bank of the Duwamish Waterway, in Tukwila.

The Draft Agreed Order is a legal agreement between Ecology and the Potentially Liable Person in order to implement the sediment evaluation work plan for this site. The sediment evaluation will provide a site specific estimation of the extent and composition of contamination, if present in the sediments, seeps and storm water adjacent to the property. This information will help determine whether the upland contamination is impacting the waterway.

The draft public participation plan outlines and describes the tools that Ecology will use to inform the public about site activities, and it identifies opportunities for the community to become involved in this process. These documents are available for review

and comment between August 24 and September 22, 2006.

Contamination on the upland portion of this site is attributed to heavy industrial use since the 1920s. Soil and/or groundwater on the upland portion of this site are contaminated with the following hazardous substances: petroleum hydrocarbons, poly-aromatic hydrocarbons (PAHs), volatile organic compounds (VOCs), polychlorinated biphenyls (PCBs), and metals (primarily arsenic, lead and copper).

Agreed Order Available for Public Comment

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Ecology is providing an opportunity for the public to comment on the Agreed Order requiring Coluccio Family LLC to develop documentation showing soil and groundwater data collected since 1991. This Order is issued by Ecology through the Model Toxics Control Act (Chapter 70.105D RCW, Chapter 173-340 WAC).

This documentation is called a Remedial Investigation/Feasibility Study (RI/FS). In addition to including all investigative soil and groundwater data, this document will evaluate the options to clean soil and groundwater. The Agreed Order will also have provisions for compliance monitoring of on-site and off-site groundwater monitoring wells.

Environmental contamination was created by releases of Perchloroethylene (PCE) to soil and groundwater from a self-service laundry facility known as the Trailer Village Laundromat. The PCE contaminated groundwater has traveled approximately one mile and has reached the City of Centralia's drinking water supply wells. Currently, the City of Centralia is operating a groundwater pumping and treating system to remove and contain PCE in groundwater.

Enforcement Order, RI/FS, CAP, Public Participation Plan available for Public Comment

Ecology is providing opportunity for the public to comment on the cleanup Enforcement Order, Remedial Investigation/Feasibility Study (RI/ FS), Cleanup Action Plan (CAP), and Public Participation Plan for the Wolfe & Parks site. This Order is issued through the Model Toxics Control Act (Chapter 70.105D RCW, Chapter 173-340 WAC). Historic bulk petroleum fueling operations resulted in soil and groundwater being polluted with petroleum hydrocarbons.

The Order requires Chevron Products Co., Dana and Diana Wolfe, Jan's Lost and Found Thrift Store, and the Cowlitz River Valley Historical Society to undertake remedial actions consisting of removal of high-concentration petroleum contaminated soil, backfilling with clean soil, paving lesser contaminated areas, treating groundwater with Oxygen Releasing Compound (ORC), removal of remaining bulk fuel operation debris, implementing institutional controls, and long-term groundwater monitoring with natural attenuation.

Pariseau Farm Dump, 1.5-miles northeast of Brewster off of Highway 97, Brewster

Public comment period: 8/10/06 – 9/11/06

Proposed Delisting from Hazardous Sites List

Ecology is proposing to remove the Pariseau Farm Dump site (Site) from its Hazardous Sites List. The Site is located approximately 1.5-miles northeast of Brewster off of Highway 97. The Site is currently ranked a "1" on the list. A rank of "1" is the highest level of concern compared to other sites on the list, and a rank of "5" is the lowest.

A Site Hazard Assessment (SHA) was conducted at the site in 1991. During the SHA, soil samples were collected from the dump site, as well as farther down the drainage area. Analytical results from the soil samples collected identified levels of DDE, Endosulfan Sulfate, Endosulfan-I and II, and Endrin.

Based upon a review of the SHA and current applicable soil cleanup regulations, Ecology has determined this site no longer poses a threat to human health and the environment and has recommended removing the site from the Hazardous Sites List.

Interim Remedial Action Plan and Determination of Non-Significance

Ecology is providing an opportunity for the public to comment on the Interim Remedial Action Plan (Plan) and the issuance of a Determination of Non-Significance (DNS) of proposed remedial actions of two areas located at the Bee Jay Scales site in Sunnyside, Washington

The site is located on and around 301 Warehouse Avenue and 116 N 1st Street, Sunnyside, Washington. Amoco Oil Co. and Chevron Chemical Co. successively owned and operated a fertilizer facility where the site is located. The site is currently owned and operated by Hickenbottom & Sons, Inc. and Bee Jay Scales, Inc., which conduct fruit warehousing and tractor trailer repairs, respectively.

A report prepared by the consulting firm Hart Crowser for Glacier Park Company informed Ecology of pesticides, fertilizers, and organic chemicals in the soil and groundwater beneath the Bee Jay Scales Site.

Ecology completed a hazard ranking of this site after receipt of the Hart Crowser Environmental Assessment in February 1992 as required by the Model Toxics Control Act (MTCA) (RCW 70.105D). A ranking of "1" was calculated for the Bee Jay Scales site using the Washington Ranking Method (one being the greatest potential risk to human health and the environment; five being the lowest).

The Plan details remedial actions to be conducted at two locations at the Bee-

Jay Scales Site. A former drum storage area at the site will be treated with an injected sodium persulfate solution to enhance chemical and biological oxidation of contaminants. Water and the liner at a formerly-used lined lagoon will be removed and transported offsite. Calcium acetate will be placed on the lagoon bottom and backfilled with clean soil. The calcium acetate will serve as a soluble electron donor to enhance biological denitrification of contaminants.

Bee Jay Scales, Inc., Hickenbottom & Sons, Inc., Chevron Chemical Co., and Amoco Oil Co. are currently under administrative Orders with Ecology to cleanup the contaminated property. Ecology will oversee the project to ensure that all terms of the Orders are satisfied.

After reviewing the SEPA environmental checklist, Ecology has determined that the cleanup action will not have a probable adverse impact on the environment and an Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) is not required.

You are invited to review and comment on the proposed Interim Remedial Action Plan, SEPA Checklist, and DNS through October 9, 2006.
