# Bridgeport Elementary and Orondo Elementary Schools Douglas County

## **Interim Remedial Action and SEPA Determination of Non-Significance**

The Washington State Department of Ecology (Ecology) is providing an opportunity for the public to comment on the Interim Remedial Action Plan and the issuance of a Determination of Non-Significance (DNS) for the soil cleanups at two schools in Douglas County, Washington. Orondo School is located at 100 School Road and the Bridgeport School is located at 1400 Tacoma Avenue.

## Site Background

Soil beneath the grass on the playgrounds at the two schools is contaminated with lead and arsenic. The contamination likely comes from the use of these chemicals as orchard pest sprays in the early and mid 20th century.

## Sampling

Sampling and analysis indicate that contamination exceeds state cleanup levels for lead and arsenic. Ecology has considered several alternatives for cleanup.

## **Cleanup Action**

The alternative preferred by Ecology at both schools consists primarily of placing clean soil on top of the existing soil, and establishing new grass on this clean soil. Ecology has determined that this alternative will provide the necessary barrier to prevent human exposure to the contaminants. At each school, the plan includes modification of the existing irrigation system to maintain the turf grass cover.

## **Determination of Non-Significance**

After reviewing the State Environmental Policy Act (SEPA) environmental checklist, Ecology has determined that the cleanup action will not have a probable significant adverse impact on the environment and an Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) is not required and is issuing a Determination of Non-Significance (DNS). The checklist and DNS may be reviewed at the locations listed in the information box on the right.

## **Ecology Seeks Your Comments**

Ecology is accepting comments on the Interim Action Plan and SEPA DNS March 28, 2007 through April 30, 2007. The box on the right provides information on where to review documents and submit comments. A public meeting is not planned for this comment period. A meeting will be held if ten or more people make a request.
