Agreed Order for Remedial Investigation and Interim Cleanup Action, and SEPA Determination Available for Public Comment

Investigation and Cleanup

The Washington State Department of Ecology (Ecology) is working with the City of Olympia to investigate and clean up the Downtown Safeway site. This is the planned site for the new Olympia City Hall building.

The City has agreed to do the following work:

- **Interim action** (partial cleanup action) to investigate and clean up possible pollution from underground storage tanks. These tanks will be addressed first to prevent further contamination.
- **Remedial investigation** of the extent and nature of pollution at the site.
- **Feasibility study** to compare possible cleanup actions.
- Draft **cleanup action plan**. This plan will guide the final cleanup process.

by cleaning up toxic pollution to meet state cleanup standards. Ecology's role is also to coordinate public involvement related to the cleanup process.

Background

The Downtown Safeway site is located at 609 4th Avenue East in Olympia. The 1.23 acre parcel is home to a former Safeway store, a two story building, and a 27,000 square foot parking lot.

A 2007 study found that as many as five abandoned underground storage tanks might be located on the site. Soil and groundwater samples showed concentrations of several pollutants above state cleanup levels (see box to the right for more information).

In January of 2008, Ecology notified the City of Olympia that they were a "potentially liable person" (PLP). The City is currently working with Ecology to plan the interim cleanup action and remedial investigation.

State Environmental Policy Act (SEPA) **Determination of Non-Significance**



Environmental cleanup projects must be reviewed to see if they will have negative impacts such as:

- Harm to human health or the environment.
- Harm to endangered species and their • habitats.
- Increased traffic or noise. •

The proposed interim cleanup actions at the Downtown Safeway site are not expected to negatively impact the environment or surrounding community.

Site Pollutants

Total petroleum hydrocarbons (TPH) These chemicals are found in gasoline and include many toxic compounds.

Humans can be exposed to petroleum hydrocarbons by breathing them in air, ingestion, and through skin contact.



Trichloroethylene (TCE)

This toxic substance is used as a solvent to remove grease from metal parts, and as an ingredient in paint removers and glues.

Humans can be exposed by breathing in TCE, skin contact with TCE-contaminated soils, or drinking TCE-contaminated water.



Benzene

A widely used industrial chemical, benzene is found in gasoline and other petroleum fuels, as well as in smoke and exhaust.

Humans are typically exposed by breathing benzene in a vapor form. Long term exposure can cause blood and bone marrow problems.

What Happens Next?

The City of Olympia plans to begin interim cleanup actions at the end of the SEPA comment period (April 25). Although this partial cleanup may happen during the end of the comment period, public comments will still be addressed.

Ecology will consider and respond to all comments in the responsiveness summary. This document will be available at the locations listed on page one, and those submitting comments will receive a copy.

The public will have an opportunity to provide comments on the remedial investigation/feasibility study report and draft cleanup plan.


