Draft legal agreement for site study ready for public review

The Washington Department of Ecology and the Port of Bellingham have completed a draft legal agreement for the Georgia-Pacific West site in Bellingham.

When final, the agreement will require the port to conduct an environmental study and analysis (called a remedial investigation/feasibility study) of the site, with Ecology oversight.

A final agreement is a required step toward cleaning up toxic contamination in the environment under the state's toxic cleanup law, the Model Toxic Control Act.

The draft legal agreement is available for public review and comment.

G-P West site and contaminants

The G-P West property is about 64 acres on the Bellingham Bay waterfront, 300 W. Laurel St. It is bordered by the Whatcom Waterway, Cornwall Avenue, East Chestnut Street and the Bellingham Shipping Terminal.

The Port of Bellingham purchased the property from Georgia-Pacific LLC in 2005.

Portions of the property are contaminated at levels that exceed standards under the state's toxic cleanup law. These contaminated areas make up the G-P West site.

The site was used to manufacture paper products from 1925 through 2007.

The Port of Bellingham and the state of Washington own portions of the site. Contamination may extend onto other properties.

Past investigations in the area found petroleum hydrocarbons, metals, dioxins, furans, polycyclic aromatic hydrocarbons (PAHs), and volatile organic compounds in soils and groundwater. These contaminants are in concentrations that exceed standards under the state's toxic cleanup law and must be addressed.

G-P and the port already have studied and cleaned up some portions of the site.

Public comment invited

Ecology is asking for your comments on the draft agreed order, the legal agreement that will require the port to complete an environmental study and analysis of the site, and a draft public participation plan.

You are invited to:

- **Review** the agreed order and public participation plan.
- **Send** your comments to Ecology for consideration. Comments will be accepted June 15 through July 15, 2009.

Overview of the agreed order

The proposed agreed order is a legal agreement between Ecology and the port.

It describes the studies that the port agrees to perform on the site. The agreed order covers the following studies and documents:

- Remedial investigation and feasibility study (RI/FS) work plan. It explains the work needed to look for and analyze contamination in soil and groundwater, and to evaluate potential effects on Bellingham Bay.
- RI/FS report. It presents the results of the study, proposes alternatives for cleanup actions, and identifies a preferred cleanup action.

The purpose of the agreed order is to direct actions that will lead to a cleanup that protects human health and the environment. It ensures that the work happens in a timely manner and according to the state's cleanup law.

Overview of the draft public participation plan

Ecology is committed to providing the public with information about cleanup activities and opportunities to participate. As part of this commitment, Ecology has prepared a draft public participation plan. This plan outlines how citizens and interested parties can learn about and provide input.

Your comments and ideas are needed to help inform cleanup activities. The public participation plan explains how Ecology will:

- Notify the public when and where documents are available for review and comment.
- Notify the public about how to become involved.
- Provide public participation opportunities.
- Respond to public comments.

What happens next?

Once the public comment period ends, Ecology will review and consider all comments it receives. The draft agreed order and public participation plan may be modified based upon your comments. If there are significant changes, Ecology will issue the documents again for public review.

As future documents about the site are developed, Ecology will notify the public of additional comment periods.

Why this cleanup matters

Cleaning up the G-P West site is necessary to protect people, plants, fish, birds and other life from exposure to harmful levels of contamination.

All phases of the cleanup, including development of the agreed order, will be conducted under the Model Toxics Control Act, passed by citizen initiative in 1988 and enacted in 1989.


