Aquatic Invasive Species Management General Permit

Under the Washington State Water Pollution Control Act, a permit is required for the discharge of pollutants that may alter the biological or chemical characteristics of a water body. Since 2001, the Washington Department of Ecology (Ecology) has required that discharges of pesticides into waters of the state require coverage under a National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) permit. This is based on the *Headwaters v. Talent Irrigation District* federal court ruling.

This proposed permit addresses these legal requirements and regulates the discharge of pollutants. The permit will allow a limited use of the following chemicals to come into contact with surface waters in the state of Washington for the purposes of managing nonnative, invasive aquatic animals and nonnative invasive marine algae:

- Algaecides.
- Herbicides.
- Insecticides.

- Molluscicides.
- Piscicides.

This permit would allow for the treatment of early infestations and for small-localized projects that may lead to the eradication of the invasive species from individual sites, or for the containment of the invasive species to one area or site. State agencies will apply for coverage under this permit prior to implementing their invasive aquatic animal and marine algae control activities.
