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# FY2011 Stormwater Retrofit and LID Competitive Grant Program

### **Summary**

The 2010 Washington State Legislature appropriated over \$54,000,000 to the Department of Ecology (Ecology) for local governments to address stormwater management and control. The funding is available to local governments covered by the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Phase I and II Municipal Stormwater permits. A portion of the appropriation is available for eligible applicants to build staffing capacity, improve stormwater research, data management, and monitoring. The remaining portion of the appropriation provides funds for local governments to plan, design, and implement stormwater retrofit or low-impact development (LID) projects.

With these funds, Ecology offered two financial assistance programs to NPDES Phase I and II city, town, and county municipal stormwater permittees. The first program, *Municipal Stormwater Capacity Grants*, provides non-competitive capacity building grants for local governments to implement the following NPDES stormwater permits:

- Phase I Municipal Stormwater General Permit
- Eastern Washington Phase II Municipal Stormwater General Permit
- Western Washington Phase II Municipal Stormwater General Permit

The second program provides funding to eligible applicants, through a competitive grant process, for stormwater retrofit and LID projects. Cities, towns, counties, and ports covered by one of the above permits were eligible to apply for the *FY2011 Stormwater Retrofit and LID Competitive Grant Program* (*FY 2011 SWRLID Competitive Program*).

This Draft Offer and Applicant List provides information on the *FY 2011 SWRLID Competitive Program*. The proposed ranked funding list and project summaries follow the text in this report.

#### Available funding and funding request amounts

Of the \$54,609,000 appropriated, \$4,609,000 was obligated through the SFY 2011 Water Quality Financial Assistance Program. From the remaining funds, \$23,510,000 is obligated in grant agreements to NPDES Phase I and II communities through the *Municipal Stormwater Capacity Grant Program*. Ecology will distribute a total of \$23,447,000 through the *FY 2011 SWRLID Competitive Program*. Ecology's total administrative costs for both programs is \$1,700,000.

The maximum grant amount for individual projects is \$1,000,000 of total eligible costs. Multiple departments from one permittee were eligible to apply for funding. An eligible permittee may not receive more than \$5,000,000 for all projects that are offered funding.

### **Applications and funding distribution**

In summary, Ecology received 100 applications with the following breakdown of project costs:

- \$176,624,598 Total Project Costs
- \$116,871,345 Total Eligible Costs
- \$58,992,448 Total Funding Requests

Following is the number of applications received, by Ecology Regional Offices:

- 7 Central Region
- 7 Eastern Region
- Northwest Region
- 28 Southwest Region

Ecology is proposing to fund 43 projects. Following is the breakdown of proposed projects by Ecology Regional Office:

### **Purpose**

The purpose of the FY 2011 SWRLID Competitive Program Draft Offer and Applicant List is to provide applicants and the general public the opportunity to comment on the proposed project ranking and funding identified in the list. The FY 2011 SWRLID Competitive Program Draft Offer and Applicant List includes footnotes on items such as ineligible projects, identification of partial eligibility, or questions and concerns about project components raised by Ecology's evaluators.

Ecology requests that applicants who want to provide project-specific comments on the proposed ranked list and associated footnotes do so during the public comment period. Ecology will review and consider the written comments prior to the issuance of the FY 2011 SWRLID Competitive Program Final Offer and Applicant List.

#### What happens after the comment period?

Ecology will consider public comments as we complete the FY 2011 SWRLID Competitive Program Final Offer and Applicant List. Ecology will include responses to comments in the Final Offer and Applicant List. Approximately mid-January, Ecology will post the FY 2011 SWRLID Competitive Program Final Offer and Applicant List to Ecology's Water Quality Program website. At the same time, Ecology will send letters to applicants informing them of their funding status.

### **Program development**

Immediately following the issuance of the 2010 Supplemental Capital Budget, Ecology communicated with interested external stakeholders regarding the stormwater appropriation.

In May 2010, Ecology convened a stakeholder workgroup to discuss grant funding options for the FY 2011 Stormwater Grant Programs. The stakeholder workgroup participants were from the Association of Washington Cities, Washington State Association of Counties, People for Puget Sound, Washington Environmental Council, local city and county governments, and Ecology management. Ecology also met with the Water Quality Program Financial Assistance Council (FAC) to discuss stormwater funding options.

Ecology received and considered valuable input from the workgroup and the FAC. From these discussions and direction from the legislative proviso language, Ecology developed two stormwater grant programs. The first program, *Municipal Stormwater Capacity Grant Program*, provided pass-through money to NPDES Municipal Phase I and II permittees for the implementation of the permit requirements. This program has been implemented and is underway.

The second program and focus of this document, is the *FY 2011 SWRLID Competitive Grant Program*. The competitive program provides funding to cities, towns, counties and ports covered by the NPDES Phase I and II Municipal Stormwater permits, for:

- Retrofit of existing stormwater projects in areas where stormwater is a significant source of contamination.
- Implementation of low-impact development stormwater projects.

#### Eligible applicants

The competitive grant process was open to cities, towns, counties, and ports covered by the Phase I, Western Washington Phase II, or the Eastern Washington Phase II Municipal Stormwater Permits.

Eligible port districts could apply for funding for port-operated facilities. Projects that are located at lessee-operated facilities on port property are not eligible for funding.

Eligible applicants had the option to partner on projects with non-eligible communities or entities. Ecology will consider the eligible applicant the lead agency on the agreement; the lead agency must collaborate and coordinate with the partners.

#### Available funding and ceiling amounts

Ecology will distribute at total of \$23,447,000 for eligible projects through this program.

The maximum grant amount for individual projects is \$1,000,000 of total eligible costs. Multiple departments from one permittee may apply for funding. An eligible permittee may not receive more than \$5,000,000 for all projects that are awarded funding.

#### Match requirement

Recipients are required to provide a 25 percent cash only match. In-kind contributions are not eligible for reimbursement.

### **Program implementation**

#### **Application process**

Applications were accepted July 1, 2010, through August 31, 2010. The application had two parts:

**Part 1** required applicants to provide general applicant information, project location, and the amount of funds requested.

**Part 2** required applicants to provide detailed information about the project and the water quality results envisioned. Ecology staff used Part 2 for the evaluation process.

Evaluation criteria

- Scope of work Overall quality of project proposed (30 percent)
- Project budget (15 percent)
- Water quality protection, restoration, improved hydrology, and other positive impacts. (30 percent)
- Project team (5 percent)
- Project development, prioritization, and partnering (10 percent)
- Readiness to proceed (10 percent)

Ecology stormwater engineers completed an initial screening of each project. After the preliminary screening, two Ecology stormwater professionals reviewed each application and provided scores and comments based on the evaluation criteria. The average of the two reviewer's scores was used to rank the list of projects. If the reviewers' scores differed by more than 100 points, a third review was completed, and the two scores that were within 100 points were averaged and used to rank the project. If ties occurred between two projects, the project with a higher score for Question #3 – Severity of the Problem, Stormwater Quality, and Hydrologic Improvements, was ranked first. If the two scores for Question #3 were the same, scores in Question #6 – Readiness to Proceed were compared and used as a second tie-breaker.

### **Environmental review requirements**

#### **SEPA and State Environmental Review Process**

All recipients must comply with State Environmental Policy Act (SEPA). The recipient must complete SEPA requirements prior to receiving state funds. Additionally, recipients must comply with all other applicable state and federal environmental statutes, regulations, and executive orders, if federal funding is used as match.

If federal funding is used as match (e.g., State Revolving Fund) the recipient must complete the State Environmental Review Process (SERP). To complete SERP, the applicant must receive Ecology's concurrence on all SEPA documents and be in compliance with all federal cross cutting authorities. In addition, if other funding agencies are involved, the applicant needs to coordinate with those other funding agencies to avoid duplication of SERP or the National Environmental Policy Act review process. For further information on SERP the applicant should contact the engineering staff of the applicable Ecology regional office

#### Historic and cultural resources review

The Water Quality Program is currently working on guidance and procedures to address preserving state historic and cultural resources. Many projects have the potential to significantly impact culturally or historically important locations or artifacts. Ecology is working with the Department of Archeology and Historic Preservation (DAHP) to meet all state or federal requirements regarding cultural and historic preservation. All projects that disturb soils from their natural state must comply with the corresponding state or federal law. Staff from Ecology's Water Quality Program will help grant recipients follow the appropriate steps to work with DAHP and corresponding tribes to determine if a site has the potential of disturbing or significantly impacting cultural or historic resources.

The City is also designing retrofits of three additional untreated outfalls to incorporate LID techniques and mitigate stormwater impacts on downstream waters including the Deschutes River, Percival Creek and Capital Lake.

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The project utilizes landscape processes, connecting a degraded stream with a stormwater wetland to: Reduce heavy sediment loads that

- o Choke spawning gravels;
- o Fill pools providing rearing habitat;
- o Impair instream turbidity;
- o Load shellfish beds with fecal coliform; Restore historic streamflows; and Restore wetland functions.
