# Chapter 173-422A WAC, Motor Vehicle Emission Inspection

The Department of Ecology proposes to adopt Chapter 173-422A WAC, Motor Vehicle Emission Inspection (Emission Check Program). The rule proposal will be published in the Washington State Register on March 2, 2011.

The purpose of this rule proposal is to allow businesses other than the state contractor to test vehicles. Other changes to the Emission Check Program requirements include:

- Having all testing by authorized testers done online using with the state contractor's computer system.
- Eliminating the gas cap test and dynamometer testing.
- Passing an OBD retest requires that the monitor(s) that detected a problem on the initial test be ready.
- Requiring the same test standards for all 1995 model year and older gasoline vehicles.
- Exempting light-duty diesel vehicles from testing.
- Tightening the test standards for heavy-duty diesel vehicles.
- Exempting heavy-duty diesel vehicles with an engine meeting 2007 emission standards or equipped with an exhaust particle filter from testing.
- Extensive rewording and reorganization to make the rule clearer and easier to understand.
- Other provisions necessary to implement the program.

Ecology issued a:

- Determination of Nonsignificance (DNS) under the State Environmental Policy Act.
- Small Business Economic Impact Statement (SBEIS).
- Preliminary Cost-Benefit analysis.

### **MORE INFORMATION**

Washington's legislature has required changes to the Emission Check Program. The current Emission Check contract expires in 2012. Ecology is currently updating the rule to reflect these changes.

The \$15 test fee will remain the same at Ecology's contractor test sites. There will be no limit on the fee non-contractor businesses may charge to perform emission tests.
