Prospective Purchaser Consent Decree Available for Public Review

Ecology invites comments on the proposed Prospective Purchaser Consent Decree for the North Lot Development site. This site is about 3.85 acres owned by King County north of Qwest Field. North Lot Development plans to develop the site as part of an intermodal regional transit hub at King Station with about 1.5 million square feet of buildable area. The development will encompass two full city blocks with residential, retail uses and two to five floors of above-ground parking. In August 2011, Ecology and North Lot Development will enter into an agreement called a Prospective Purchaser Consent Decree for the site cleanup. In the proposal, North Lot Development agrees to:

• Prepare a draft and final Remedial Investigation/Feasibility Study (RI/FS) Report. The RI/FS reports present the results of the investigation and evaluate the cleanup alternatives.

• Prepare a Draft Cleanup Action Plan (DCAP).

In 2009 the City of Seattle completed an EIS addendum that evaluated the North Lot redevelopment and the conceptual cleanup associated with the redevelopment. Based on the conceptual cleanup, the city determined that no significant unavoidable impacts are anticipated. The final cleanup action plan consists of the same actions as the conceptual cleanup evaluated by the city. Pursuant to WAC 197-11-600, Ecology finds that the city's EIS Addendum and determination provides sufficient SEPA analysis for the Consent Decree and CAP. Ecology has prepared a Public Participation Plan for the Site. The Plan describes the tools and approaches used to inform the public, request comments, and engage them in the cleanup process.

Slip 4 Source Control Status Report Completed; Upland Site Soil Removal Planned Ecology recently completed an Interim Source Control Status Report for the Slip 4 area next to the North Boeing Field/Georgetown Steam Plant site. The report indicates that enough source control work has been completed to allow for the U.S. Environmental Agency (EPA) to move forward with sediment cleanup at the head of Slip 4 this year. EPA will provide information about the cleanup as more construction details become available. Work to control sources of contaminants to Slip 4 is continuing. As part of a legal agreement with Ecology, the Boeing Company (Boeing), King County and the City of Seattle (City) will remove contaminated soil and groundwater from areas in the northern portion of the site this summer. The soil and groundwater in these areas are contaminated with polychlorinated biphenyls (PCBs). Contaminated groundwater will be treated and disposed to the King County sanitary sewer system. Contaminated soils will be disposed in permitted hazardous waste or solid waste landfills. More details on the planned soil removal will be posted on Ecology's website as information becomes available.

The North Boeing Field/Georgetown Steam Plant site is on the east side of the Lower Duwamish Waterway in Seattle. Industrial operations and maintenance caused contamination at the site. Contaminants of concern are polychlorinated biphenyls (PCBs); total petroleum hydrocarbons (TPH); polynuclear aromatic hydrocarbons (PAHs); volatile and semi-volatile organic compounds (VOCs and SVOCs); antimony, arsenic, cadmium, chromium, copper, lead, mercury, and zinc.

Ecology invites comments on the Periodic Review for the Norseland site and proposed removal of this site from the state's Hazardous Sites List. This site was a former mobile home park, a former landfill and former U.S. military base.

The site is entirely within the Port of Bremerton's Olympic View Business and Industrial Park. The site cleanup actions required the consolidation of waste within a designated area. The waste was covered by a permeable soil cap (minimum of 18 inches) with vegetated topsoil cover (minimum of 6 inches).

The requirements included cap maintenance, surface water control, restrictive covenants on the land, and compliance monitoring. Compliance monitoring included groundwater and ambient air monitoring. The restrictive covenants were recorded on the property deed.

Ecology has performed a periodic review for this site to confirm cleanup standards were achieved and have been maintained. The former landfill was closed consistent with regulations at the time of closure. The periodic review evaluates site conditions and monitoring data, after cleanup is considered complete. This review focuses on the post-cleanup monitoring results.

Based on the site review and monitoring results, Ecology has determined the site meets state cleanup standards. This site has completed cleanup and post-monitoring results, and it no longer represents a threat to human health or the environment.

Ecology proposes removing this site from the state's Hazardous Sites List and returning oversight to the Kitsap County Health District. The site will remain under closure permit from the Kitsap County Health District.

All requirements or conditions under any applicable solid waste regulations and the closure permit remain in effect.

Remedial Investigation Report

The site was used as a gravel pit until it was closed in 1969. Gemini Management Inc. then began operating the site as a disposal area. From 1969 until 1974, Kaiser transported aluminum black dross from the Trentwood plant in the Spokane Valley to the disposal site. Black dross is a by-product from processing aluminum materials.

In March 2009, Kaiser Aluminum & Chemical Corporation, LLC (now known as DCO Management, LLC) and Ecology entered into an agreed order. The order required Kaiser to conduct a Remedial Investigation and Feasibility Study at the Heglar Kronquist site.

The purpose of the investigation was to find out if site-related contaminants are in groundwater on and near the site. The focus was on contaminants related to aluminum dross. Surface water and groundwater were evaluated to determine risk factors for humans, plants, aquatic, and wildlife in the site area.

Drinking water is not impacted by site-related contaminants. Surface water and groundwater, in certain areas, showed concentrations of nitrate above state standards for human health. These areas with elevated levels are not being used for drinking water.

Results of the domestic well testing done prior to the Remedial Investigation indicate properties outside of the site boundaries are not impacted by site-related contaminants. One private well was within the groundwater impact area; however, the well draws from a deep aquifer in the area and was not impacted by site-related contaminants.

The contaminants that exceeded other water quality standards are chloride, TDS, and manganese. Sodium exceeds the Environmental Protection Agency's (EPA) recommended upper limit advisory at three monitoring wells.

All concentrations of chemicals tested both on the site and at the site boundaries were below required state standards for air emissions.

Some soil and groundwater contamination still remains. However, the current building prevents people from coming into contact with contamination. Proposed Interim Cleanup Available for Public Review

Ecology invites comments on a proposed interim cleanup of the Cornwall Avenue Landfill site in Bellingham. The interim action will place dredged material over a portion of the upland area of the site, contour it to redirect rainwater, and then cover it with a waterproof sheet. This will reduce the flow of contaminated groundwater to Bellingham Bay. Construction is scheduled to begin in September 2011.

The interim action is described in a proposed amendment to a 2005 legal agreement, called an agreed order, between Ecology, the Port of Bellingham and the City of Bellingham. The proposed amendment includes a detailed plan for the interim action as well as general language providing for potential future interim actions.

Ecology hosted a public meeting on June 8 to discuss the interim action. The meeting was held in Conference Room 103B in Building G at Bellingham Technical College, 3028 Lindbergh Ave.

This site is about 19,000 square feet in Little Squalicum Park in Bellingham, west of the Bellingham Technical College campus parking lot. The interim action will remove historic municipal solid waste and contaminated soils, and dispose of them at a permitted landfill. The excavated area will be backfilled with clean soil. Follow-up testing will determine if additional cleanup is needed to meet state cleanup standards. Construction is scheduled to begin in August 2011.

Ecology needs wellhead elevation and groundwater level data

Starting on June 22, 2011, Ecology will roll out new templates and features to the agency's Environmental Information Management (EIM) database.

These templates and features will allow you to enter wellhead elevation and groundwater level data into EIM. EIM can then calculate groundwater elevations across the state. They are used for a variety of purposes, including for assessing water resources and contaminated site cleanup. These new features will help Ecology to capture accurate and useful environmental data.

Groundwater "data submittal" and "search" tools have now been added. These new tools will allow you to enter wellhead elevation and groundwater level data. You will also have the capability to query and map the data.

The core issue for this new EIM database rollout is capturing water level information. Previously, Ecology has not required users to enter that information into EIM. However, in the future, if you measure a water level in a well, then Ecology would like you to enter that information into EIM. Most of this new protocol will apply to Ecology's Toxics Cleanup Program. Per Policy 840-1, you are required to submit data (electronically) to EIM. This also applies to Voluntary Cleanup Program (VCP) sites.

If you are entering data into the EIM database, then you must now report a wellhead elevation (e.g. top of casing, etc.) in addition to horizontal (X,Y) coordinates (e.g. longitude / latitude) for all wells ("resource protection wells," WAC 173-160-400). The wellhead elevation is needed for groundwater elevations.

Please use the North American Vertical Datum of 1988 (NAVD 88) when you report elevations. This is important because groundwater elevation data is less useful if a common vertical datum is not used. Ecology recognizes and understands that for many sites, such as gas stations, use of a site-specific or "local" datum was a common past practice. However, after June 22, 2011, you will not be allowed to enter "local" datum elevations to EIM. You must either survey to the NAVD 88 or other specified major datum.

Just to be clear, Ecology does not expect you to go back out and re-survey "old" wells. These new database EIM features and requirements are not retroactive. However, if you plan to complete and drill new wells, then please collect all relevant information, such as water depth and wellhead elevation.

Changes made to electronic cleanup site searches

The "Cleanup Sites – Information by County" web page has been updated to reflect an improved way of searching and retrieving information related to Washington cleanup sites.

Since the early 1980s, when major federal and state cleanup programs were created, Ecology's Toxics Cleanup Program has identified and helped to clean up contaminated sites. The new cleanup site search tool is intended to expand search options to allow the public to search an inventory of sites currently being investigated, cleaned up, or that have already completed the cleanup process. Additional site-specific information can be obtained by clicking on links within the individual web pages.

Links to cleanup sites bookmarked using the old "Cleanup Sites – Information by County" page are no longer functional. The user will now be redirected to the "Cleanup Site Search" page: https://fortress.wa.gov/ecy/gsp.

GLOSSARY

Agreed Order - A legal agreement with Ecology to make sure the cleanup meets the standards of Washington State's cleanup law, the Model Toxics Control Act (MTCA).

Cleanup Action Plan (CAP) - A document that describes the selected cleanup method(s) and specifies cleanup standards and other requirements. It is based on information and technical analyses generated during the RI/FS and consideration of public comments and community concerns. A draft of the CAP (DCAP) is made available for public review and comment before finalizing.

Comment Period - A time period during which the public can review and comment on various documents and Ecology or EPA actions. For example, a comment period is provided to allow community members to review and comment on proposed cleanup action alternatives and proposed plans. Also, a comment period is held to allow community members to review and comment on draft feasibility studies.

Consent Decree - A formal legal agreement that is filed with a court. It describes studies and/or cleanup work to be done at a site and the terms under which that work is to be done.

Engineering Design Report - Engineering design reports outline the specific details for implementation and operation of the first phase of the cleanup actions.

ERTS - Environmental Response Tracking System

Five-Year Periodic Review - A periodic review is conducted at least every five years after the initiation of a cleanup action at a site, as required by the Model Toxics Control Act (MTCA). The purposes of the review are to evaluate site conditions, after cleanup is considered complete, and to ensure protection of human health and the environment.

Hazardous Sites List - A statewide list of contaminated properties. Ecology may remove a site from the list only after determining that all remedial actions except confirmational monitoring have been completed and compliance with the cleanup standards has been achieved at the site, or the listing was erroneous.

Independent Cleanup Action - Any remedial action without department oversight or approval and not under an order or decree

LUST - Leaking Underground Storage Tank

NFA - No Further Action

PSI - Puget Sound Initiative

Publication Participation Plan - Outlines and describes the tools Ecology will use to inform the public about site activities, and it identifies opportunities for the community to become involved in this process.

RCW - Revised Code of Washington

Remedial Action - Construction work done to clean up a contaminated site.

Remedial Investigation/Feasibility Study - Two distinct but related studies. They are usually performed at the same time, and together referred to as the "RI/FS."

Responsiveness Summary - A summary of oral and/or written public comments received by Ecology during a comment period on key documents, and Ecology's responses to those comments.

RI/FS - See Remedial Investigation/Feasibility Study

SEPA - State Environmental Policy Act

SHA, **Site Hazard Assessment** - An assessment to gather information about a site to confirm whether a release of hazardous substances has occurred and to enable Ecology to evaluate the relative potential hazard posed by the release.

UST - Underground Storage Tank

UXO - Unexploded Ordnance VCP - Voluntary Cleanup Program

Voluntary Cleanup Program (VCP) - The VCP is one of several options for cleaning up a hazardous waste site under the state's cleanup law. Under this option, property owners may perform a cleanup independently and request services from Ecology for a fee.

WAC - Washington Administrative Code

WARM, Washington Ranking Method - The method used to rank sites placed on the Hazardous Sites List.
