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Ecology publishes this document to meet the requirements of the Washington State Administrative Procedure Act (RCW 34.05.325)

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Purpose

Ecology provides the information in this implementation plan to meet agency and Administrative Procedure Act (RCW 34.05.328) requirements related to rule adoptions.

Introduction

The purpose of this rule implementation plan is to inform those who must comply with the SEPA (State Environmental Protection Act) Rules Chapter 197-11 WAC about how the Department of Ecology (Ecology) intends to:

- Implement and enforce the rule.
- Inform and educate persons affected by the rule.
- Promote and assist voluntary compliance for the rule.
- Evaluate the rule.
- Train and inform Ecology staff about the new or amended rule.

Also included in this plan is information about:

- Supporting documents that may need to be written or revised because of the new rule or amended rule.
- Other resources where more information about the rule is available.
- Contact information for Ecology employees who can answer questions about the rule implementation.

Implementation and Enforcement

This rule amends and updates the existing rule. The State Environmental Policy Act (SEPA) is a statewide policy that applies to decisions made by state and local agencies within Washington State, including state agencies, counties, cities, ports and special districts. SEPA applies to all “lead agencies”. It is the responsibility of the “lead agency” to implement environmental review of a specific proposal. SEPA does not have an enforcement component. Ecology will conduct outreach and provide guidance to lead agencies on the rule changes and how to implement the flexible options of the rule. SEPA staff will also be provide one-on one technical assistance for lead agencies as requested.

Informing and Educating Persons Affected by the Rule

Ecology will issue a press release about the rule adoption and send email notice to the SEPA rule making Advisory Committee, the SEPA listserv and all individuals, organizations and companies that commented on the proposed rule.

The final rule language will be posted on the agency’s rule web page and the SEPA program web pages. The codified rule incorporating these revisions will be posted on the agency web page when the revised rule is completed by the Office of the Code Reviser.

Promoting and Assisting Voluntary Compliance

SEPA rules have been in place since the early 1970's. Lead agencies are already aware of their responsibility under SEPA. Ecology will conduct outreach and provide guidance on the changes to the SEPA rules. Ecology will also continue to provide technical SEPA assistance through our SEPA help desk and email. Ecology will also send messages out to over 500 plus listserv members about the recently adopted rule changes.

Evaluating the Rule

The purpose of this rule is to create higher levels of flexibility for lead agencies to exempt minor new construction projects. Ecology will evaluate the success of the rule by analyzing if lead agencies choose to adopt the higher thresholds and if these agencies understand the steps they need to take in order to adopt higher thresholds for minor new construction.

Training and Informing Ecology Staff

The SEPA unit at Ecology will train and inform Ecology staff about the changes in the SEPA rules by providing training and updating the "Responsible Officials Guide". The SEPA unit will continue to provide technical assistance as needed to individual staff.
