### Ecology assistance

Ecology can respond to or provide technical assistance with:

- Oil or hazardous materials releases/spills
- Illegal/ clandestine drug manufacturing facilities
- Abandoned drums and containers
- Clean up and disposal of waste
- Hiring clean-up or response contractors
- Community air monitoring
- Distressed or deceased fish/wildlife related to an oil or hazardous materials releases/spill
- Notification or messaging to other agencies, stakeholders, or the public

### Other Assistance

#### Emerging environmental issues

Ecology works to stay informed on emerging environmental issues related to oil and hazardous materials releases/spills and responses. We are continuously seeking opportunities to coordinate with emergency responders on these topics such as PFOS/PFOA, emerging battery technologies, etc.

#### Ecology's Equipment Grant Program

Many communities don't have response resources for spills of oil or hazardous materials. To help solve this problem, Ecology provides equipment and training grants to emergency responders.
